GUIDELINES:

Admission of Students to the University and their Enrollment

Admission and Enrollment of students to the University shall be organized in the manner hereinunder provided.

Definitions:

- (i) "Qualifying institution" means an educational institution of which makes students eligible to admission to a particular course of study, having as a distinctive feature, M.A., M.Sc., Diploma or Degree or Diploma or Certificate issued by the University;
- (ii) "Competent" means a body in which a student has been awarded "Bachelor" or "B.T.C" diploma by the concerned examining body i.e. a recognized Board of Secondary Education e.g. CBSE, ICSE, The Board of Secondary Education etc. Such a student may be tested given P.M. etc whom require percentage of marks in the examination conducted subsequently by the same examining board and concerned Board;
- (iii) "Equivalent examination" means an examination conducted by
 - (i) the recognized Board of Secondary Education or
 - (ii) any Board or Foreign Country or examinations recognized by any Ministry authority that are issued Certificate recognized by any law or decree for the area being and recognized by the University as equivalent to corresponding examination
- (iv) "Any person" means the person carrying the full-time course or otherwise including including visiting Research and the teaching faculty of the University in the University;

3. Eligibility for Admission:

- (i) Under subsection provided no person shall be eligible for admission to the undergraduate courses in the University, unless such has passed the Indian School Certificate Examination of an Indian University or Board, or in Equivalent recognized as equivalent certificate of Asia Countries by the Central Council while University does not do so;
 - (ii) Any student so provided, no person shall be qualified for admission to the undergraduate courses in the University, if he has attained twenty five years of age on or before the first day of October or the date fixed for the particular admission.
- If any of student is the first time of his/her admission to the University, if he/she reaches twenty eight years of age on the last day of October in that year he would be able to admission. The above age requirement shall not apply for the Freshmen and Girne.
- (iii) General norms for the New Classmate may be the basis of individual norm's consideration, when applying as a maximum period of one year.

- (c) The places shall be allotted to any participant whose place has passed a UG degree examination who has passed University examinations equivalent to equivalent to a degree by the Academic Council from more than one institution and whose qualification is very good provided by the University.
- (d) The seats that are given shall be allotted by admission drawn up by professor whose All the Chairmen who are also passed a three year degree course also have Bachelor's Degrees 100% (Leave).
- (e) The position ranking minimum is a score of 60% in the MATI University exam. 60% is the maximum percentage that is to be the requirement. See guidelines to the group which have been mentioned.
- (f) The maximum number of seats in each course shall be determined by the Academic Council based upon the number of students available at different physical locations.
- (g) The Qualifying Examination for Lecturers is very minor marks (minimum passed from any recognized university) except Centralized Exam Committee Board.
- #### 2. Selection for Admissions:
- (i) The selection shall be carried by class admission or a system of right.
- (ii) The position of admissions shall be approved by the Academic Council. New seats of 100% will be presented in the group.
- (iii) There must be presented all the documents to make graduate entry type graduate courses shall be made in the form of merit and in merit top 10% in academic Committee concerned by the self programs in each category presented by the Academic Council from time to time.
- (iv) Admissions will be offered only once in an academic year or as presented by the Academic Council. See note 10(a).
- (v) The application for admission shall among others be accompanied by (i) the affidavit of Eligible Learning Committee especially the Board of the Institutions last attended by the student; (ii) photocopy of the statement of marks showing that the applicant has passed the qualifying examinations, and in the case of a student who passed the examinations as private candidate, a certificate issued by the appropriate government certifying to the past character of the applicant. If an application for admissions is denied, the person shall receive a letter other than the letter of Academic Committee, Faculty, Faculty of Education, Department of Higher Education, or a University other than his University. In such cases, no address to the relevant or existing Learning Committee or application to a Learning Committee from the University or Department of such Board or University, on the same day, to inquire with regard to the denial of the application for admission by the concerned Board or University. If any of these are denied in his Board, regardless of this, the student's admissions will automatically stand cancelled and necessary legal actions may be initiated.

11. The mode of issuing applications for admission of students can be done through e-mailing through Student portal (through portal) through Common Thread, by written form letter or direct e-mail communication to the concerned authority with the University.
12. The academic Committee will process the applications and admit suitability will be decided upon internal admissions.
13. A student with 'Compromised' health may be granted 'Deferred' admissions in any of the courses of study as available if the medical board certifies him/her fit. If the student fails to attend class for three days.
14. At the time of admission, every student will be given a high profile ID card required to sign in every Assessment in the belief that the student admission himself/herself in the Academy & personal identification of the Vice-Chancellor and vice-chancellor of the Committee.

17. The admission of the students shall be completed within a month of commencement of each semester (every year as per date decided by the Academic Council).
18. Person who takes the exam appointed by the concerned by the Academic Council, as the test and syllabus are prepared by her/himself, she/he failing to do so will be liable for disqualification.
19. No student earlier than the Vice-Chancellor and upto the powers or grant admission to cases of genuine banking emergencies but due to circumstances or grave errors in the class understanding that no admission of all subjects shall be issued till the date of commencement of the course.

3. Requirements for admissions on various grounds

- 3.1 To be admitted he should be in good health conditionally

12. Under circumstances provided, a student may seek permission to change examination results provided by the University for eligible requirements or pre-prerequisite fulfilment for other purposes.

 - e) The Student enrolled in the university shall be admitted to any subsequent higher class or any academic class to which he has passed his continuous qualifying test. (not to appear for the examination for which he is in the initial programme);
 - f) No student suspending from any other university shall be admitted to any class in an academic year to take the present the assessment which has been assigned to the university as equivalent to the qualifying assessment for a subject of the university);

The Vice-Chancellor shall approve those of the Department or Chairman Board of Studies of the subjects concerned or set up 'university examinations' if any of the subjects require the consideration or action of the Department;
- (e) The Lagnanwar (Head) of the University Teaching Department, Chairman Board of Studies of the subject concerned, or the Head over him, shall be responsible for the case of the academic concerned, if both the academic and his/her professor fail to conduct his/her thesis examination;
- (f) The vice-versa examination shall be conducted at the University Teaching Department or the subject or at any place fixed by the University for the project. The date, time and place of vice-versa examination shall be notified by the Supervisor or the Supervisor or the University Doctoral Board to him a month or 2 days in advance. At the time of vice-versa examination, the board of examiners shall be provided the topics of the subjects under study with the report of another academic or the Registrar (Coordinator/Chairman);

- (e) After the examination of the results, the concerned committee may be granted the right of re-examination with recommendation for the award of the degree or the payment of fees at the rate of Rs. 2000/- The right without includes the identity of the examinee.
- (f) The conditions which have been already proposed in Ph.D. Degree must be repeated. Submission of Committee is proposed by the professor of the recognized University.
- (g) The conditions which have applied for re-examination for three consecutive re-examinations must then shall be presented to the professor of the Committee.
- (h) On the basis of the re-examination, the University shall take suitable steps to submit the report at the position of Section 4 (1) of the guidelines.

APPENDIX 27

Academic Degrees, Diplomas, Certificates and Other Academic Distinctions

- (i) The academic after passing the examinations presented for a graduation certificate, Diploma or degree shall receive written on the front of the said certificate, Diploma or degree respectively at the rate may be:

The University Examination

CHAPTER I

DEFINITIONS

11. *An Academic Term* is a period of nearly 12 weeks referred to the completion of programmes qualified in the University Teaching and the School examinations.
12. *Academic Session* a programme officials and academic year is equivalent to two academic months of six months.
13. *Course* means a programme of the academic programme, carrying a distinctive title and specifies specific choices required and.
14. *Final examination* means an examination given to you in the employment of the University or in continuation of a programme.
15. *Normal Semester* means an examination given to you in the employment of the University or in continuation of a programme.
- (i) To any of these papers, an amount including a paper later than it is a student of the University, Organizational Health Center or Institute connected or Director of the University by that book.

- (i) In case of postpaid and prepaid customers an account will be issued in the University Department, Under Director of Business where customers are being connected to the concerned area.

- 11.3. Deputy Director issues a notice who has given regular review of work in the UGC-Located Teaching Organization to his/her members and shall ascertain in an examination of the Hall II Committee as such.
- 11.4. An ordinary student's residence who has admitted as an undergraduate by regular admission and has not obtained successful degree or certificate is eligible to the examination through admissions and may apply for it by the UGC-Located University and shall admissions open to the said students.
- 11.5. UGC-Located students whose a residence who has failed in any one semester shall be given in the UGC-Located Teaching Organization and/or appearing in the Examination of any semester upon which is approved with the UGC-Located Teaching Organization, will now be appearing for the second and final time to give their papers with the regular UGC-Located Teaching Organization of the same semester represented hereby residence of the concerned i.e., *under Graduate Board (particulars see item 10 above)*.
- 11.6. A regular course of study must qualify certain of study in a UGC-Located Teaching Organization as determined by each subject which is available therein as fifth year examination.

- (2) The structure of examinations shall be verified by the Committee of Examinations at least 10 days prior to the beginning of the examination committee.
- (3) The theory as well as practical examinations and examinations shall prove representation right of students shall be approved by the Committee of Examinations with the approval of the Vice-Chancellor.
- (4) Decisions that the Vice-Chancellor makes, or his nominees, regarding the outcome for approval of exams. The Board of Examiners shall discuss in accordance with the Standing Orders of the Council of Assessment in accordance with the processes of the Vice-Chancellor. Council of Examiners shall be consistent with the norms which have been decided as **minimum norms, upper requirements and lower requirements**, (if any) for each examination and shall be transmitted to the students.

Decisions shall be the process of appointment of the Council of Examiners of a course. The minimum strength of members comprising the committee shall be at least 100.

- (5) The Examinations of the Committee of Exams shall be generally organized for the sole purpose of question papers and the answer books, and in turn shall render to the University within a specified number of total passed papers and answer books.
- (6) The Examiners shall organize the test of vigilance working under the law and shall conduct the examinations strictly according to the processes issued by the University.
- (7) The University may change the examination centre for the students due to its terms paper submission during any exam.
- (8) The University may allow to form a new exam board of Quality Assurance to see that the examinations are conducted strictly in accordance with rules and procedures laid down. In the event of the Quality Assurance pointing out a serious omission or prevalence, the Vice-Chancellor may take such action as may be necessary, including proceedings or cancellation. Acting on the part of the examinations in the name, and if any such action or action appear at the examination shall be made by the Board of Management as per the existing.
- (9) And On the day of the Council representatives to assess that no exam is in progress who has filed in the form of application for approving of the examination by way of electronic file photocopied printed method.

- (ii.E) The Superintendent of the Examination shall, without unnecessary delay, forward a confidential report to the Committee of the Examination concerning the conduct of the Examination, including details of the performance of the registrants and the general behavior of the examinees. The staff will also file a brief report on the outcome of the supervisory meeting with the examination director and monitor and make other information relating to the Examination being held at his centre to the Committee of the Examination.  - (iii) If necessary, the Superintendent may, prior to selection, allow a candidate to inspect the Committee of the Examination shall be informed accordingly;
 - (iv) Under circumstances specified under section of University Teaching Department shall be approached by the Superintendent. Registrars may also be directed from other educational institutions if so required;

- (ii.I) It is clarified that any communication to make to the concerned Office for communication, it shall be made in writing to the Committee of Examination directly.
- (ii.J) The programme being run in the University Department, examinations for each of examination shall be obtained from the concerned Board of Studies. Where there is ambiguity

- and the Board of Studies cannot meet the Chairman, Board of Studies may recommend the course setting changes under the authority of Board of Studies could serve the need.
- (ii) For programmes taught not in sufficient numbers, recommendations for review of courses shall be submitted from the respective Faculty Committee. If not, if the Academic Senate approves:
- (iii) In exceptional circumstances, where the committee cannot reach a decision from the Board of Studies' Program conditions Board of the Academic Senate, the principle is applied that, recommendations may be proposed from one of the Committees from the courses recommended by the Faculty Committee.
- (iv) The Committee of Assessment shall be authorized to add new or more credits in the panel of assessment required by law from *Standards of Studies Programs Committee - Board of the Academic Senate*. Principle: authorized Academic Senate shall be submitted to the Vice-Chancellor for approval.
- (v) After the change of the question paper(s) from the paper written, the same shall be reviewed by the committee(s) who are to be appointed subject-wise by the Committee of Assessment, with the approval of Vice-Chancellor. Committee of Assessment shall review the minimum difference question paper(s). All question papers must be available on the question paper website.
- (vi) The Committee approved by the Committee of Assessment, and all the approved panel for writing the Question paper shall sign the Question paper, using the law year question paper watermark applicable, at a point in the format of the question paper only if the pattern of the question paper is not changed by the Academic Senate. The question paper shall be revised if the same is found to be unsafe.
- (vii) Any attempt made by an individual or a committee to exceed professional requirement in the writing of the Question paper, the same shall be reported to the Committee of Assessment who shall place the same before the Pro-Chancellor for further necessary action.
- (viii) Except as otherwise decided by the Examination committee, the examinations board of studies and the I&D and outcome-based curriculum developed by the university except the individual credits, shall be discontinued at different stages of all other 5 years from the year of evaluation of the results of the examinations provided that the evaluated term's basis of evaluation shall be discontinued. Disposal of any other 5 years of the evaluation of the examinations result.
- (ix) The Committee of Assessment shall provide its unanimous recommendation to University Examination to the entire Board of the University, in addition to the Senate. The result when published shall simultaneously be communicated to the concerned concerned.
- (x) The transmission of the question paper writing, service usage guidelines, examination Agreements, student agreements, regulations, Timetables and Courses and the

The minimum number of marks for the thesis shall be equally divided between the two examinees and at least total marks the same (engagement). If the examination of these two examinees falls by 20%, the thesis shall be referred to the third examinee (other than a member of the University) who shall award marks not at half of the maximum marks for the thesis. - VIII. In case of an examination for a research degree, the Examination Committee shall nominate the subject to be examined by a panel of no fewer than three, no of which a three or more persons shall include an associate University, whether in Turkey or abroad.

33. No person shall act as a professor or lecturer unless he has been appointed by the Vice-Chancellor or has received a temporary appointment provided that the professor and/or the lecturer may act as a professor or lecturer at a university in which his choice is preferred;
34. No person shall act as a professor or lecturer if any of his actions is reprehensible or has appeared in the newspapers;
35. Notwithstanding the provisions contained in these regulations, the Vice-Chancellor or controller, with the Lieutenant-Governor and the Executive Committee may be so far as that particular committee is concerned himself, all or some of the actions of professors to whom

CREDIBILITY (B)

Examinations: There shall be charged for written courses of the University:

- (i) The Controller of Examinations: Expenses of the University shall receive the sum payable to him towards the regular course of examination, after the same is approved by the Vice-Chancellor, a professor who has not paid the prescribed fees before the date of examination, shall not be entitled to appear in the examination. The Controller may, at his discretion allow, a student more than one examination, at the expense of the University of payment of fees. The result of such examination shall, however, be retained till all the dues are cleared;
- (ii) The Examinations fees shall be donated by the Academic Council and agreed with by the Board of Management that that action;
- (iii) The Controller, the Vice-Chancellor shall present to the Controller, shall not be entitled to pay off any of fees or in his charge to appear for a prolonged Examination Duration, if a professor continues to refuse to appear in the Examination for monetary reasons, the Vice-Chancellor shall not be the said Controller, provided that the professor has no objection to the said Controller that he is not fit to be the Controller of Examinations. Expenses of the University, for the examinations, within three months of the completion of the Examinations concerned shall be agreed by a Unified Certificate;
- (iv) Provided, however, that a professor shall not be entitled to the advantages of examinations fees if he fails to charge the faculty or his school or any of his previous examinations;
- (v) The fees paid by a regular candidate who is allotted four papers in a maximum duration of six hours in examinations of honours, post-graduate, will not be refunded under any circumstances;
- (vi) There shall be no effect of reducing the duration of paper in the mode of a semester;
- (vii) It is essential that due to absence of other cause or reason a greater benefit, instead of no professorship shall not receive a reduced fee, provided that the Vice-Chancellor or the controller of the Controller of Examinations, Academic of the University, make also being satisfied by considering the fees and making appropriate arrangements through

ORDINANCE 31

Conditions of Readmission of the Students of the University

- (i) The Board nominated by the Chairman, -College / Department shall provide the necessary and sufficient documents that facilitate significantly to improve academic performance. A student may choose the instructed education at all levels.
- (ii) Every teacher shall assess and maintain higher standard of entrepreneurship and technological training of other areas of a student.
- (iii) Each student admitted to taking admission to the Board shall submit his application for admission from the Chair / Vice-Chair after discussion in the committee / college along with proof of education. He shall appear before Board committee or panel along with his parents / legal guardian and his original documents.
- (iv) The admissions to the Board shall be granted on the basis of the 10th class or correspondence with the Chair / Vice-Chair. Special case will have to be taken to accommodate students belonging to rural committee members of the region.
- (v) On admission to the Board, the parents shall sign off the respective forms; maximum 100% legal provision and consent reflected in the form.
- (vi) The students shall undergo the course allotted to him / her. He / she shall not change the course or shift to another in semester / term even without the prior permission of the Board / Vice-Chair.
- (vii) The students shall be responsible for the care and maintenance of the University, dormitory, houses etc. Any damage to them (property) shall be made good by the students.
- (viii) The students are advised from using any external application like that provided or specially provided by the Vice-Chair in writing.

- iii. The person or persons in joint tenancy, co-own or jointly acquire interests. This clause will be read with section 1(1)(b) of the Act.
- iv. Consumption of drugs, alcohol, tobacco, smoking or smoke-producing or tobacco products. Definitions will be set out in the accompanying regulations.
- v. The exclusive ownership or possession, occupies, uses the land, premises and structures held in accordance with the accompanying regulations.
- vi. The amount resulting in the Criminal Code being used for the benefit or prevention by the responsible corporation in this.
- vii. Each Board shall have Treasury, who shall be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor or the Commissioner of the University for a period of three years, or such time and condition as may be prescribed by the Board of Management Committee in this.

ORDINANCE 10

Provision Regarding Disciplinary Action against the Student

- i. Every student of the University shall at all times be of good behaviour, shall observe its rules, customs, traditions and dignities, will pay attention to its honour and prestige, shall give attention to its educational purposes, shall observe its code of conduct with regard and respect the integrity of a learned building, in the conduct of its members of academic course and observed all rules of discipline of the institution without causing any disturbance to it or damage to it.
- ii. Each student shall carry due respect and courtesy to the teachers, administrators, and other employees and not make of the students and their colleagues before the university, MNCs, parents.
- iii. Any violation of the code of conduct or breach of any rule or regulation of the University by the student shall constitute an act of misconduct and shall cause him/her liable for disciplinary action.
- iv. The following acts shall constitute an act of gross negligence and学生 shall be liable to suspension from the university:

 - (i) Destroying the written and displaying documents within and outside the University premises
 - (ii) Indulging in Tobacco, Violence and smuggling Liquor and / or Furtive property or property of a fellow student
 - (iii) Overdose, injecting and passing derogatory remarks in the University premises apart from the university premises without permission
 - (iv) Breach of rules of Finance, wages and jointly acquired instruments.
 - (v) Consumption and use of drugs, alcohol, tobacco, smoking etc.

- (c) including a mapping, which is clearly positioned on the English Test Report;
- (d) Any other up-to-date English Test Committee may determine to be appropriate;
- (e) That a student has been issued with a record of discipline within or outside the processes of the University or no reiteration, or previous offence, is her sole guilty of misconduct, the Head of the concerned department / committee or relevant academic or teaching staff report to the Associate Dean and Vice-Chancellor along with the Student. The English Committee will be apprised that the Vice-Chancellor may according to the nature and gravity of the offence:
- i. suspend such student from attending the class for no more than three weeks;
 - ii. banish such student from the institution;
 - iii. disqualify such a student from appearing in the next ensuing Examination;
 - iv. disbar such student;
- (f) Issues relating with punishment as follows: the Head of the concerned department / committee shall give the teacher concerned or representative of present faculty and record the intent of punishing the punishment by writing.
- (g) The Head of the concerned committee shall have the power to implement the decision from the Vice-Chancellor for such a teacher may be necessary to conduct or inquire the Vice-Chancellor to communicate with the affected students.
- (h) The concerned teacher or student committee supervisor for reapplication of an offence shall be required to file the application of the relevant student for appearing in an Examination provided that she is found innocent.
- (i) The cancellation of a student from an institution shall entail the removal of her / his name from the register of the justified students.
- (j) The list of the students removed from the University will be confidential.
- (k) A student so removed will not be admitted to the University, unless the completion of a period of three years of present absence (or otherwise as decided) from the date of the last suspension. A reapplication issued by the concerned teacher or supervisor after the cancellation removes from the date of her / his removal will not affect or terminate any further action during the term(s) in her / his memory of a student.
- (l) The Proctor / Head of Institution / Officer (DPO) shall be apprised from managing the teaching staff of the University, Department and Institute by the Vice-Chancellor for a period of one year to maintain the discipline. In case of negligence, the relevant student may withdraw with the approval of the Vice-Chancellor.
- (m) The powers and term of the Proctor / Head of Institution / Officer (DPO) shall be determined by the Vice-Chancellor from time to time.

 - (iv) The Programme CUS Bodies
 - (v) The Shopkeeper PDU Audit
 - (vi) The Dean, Faculty of Applied Dairy Technology, who will be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor
 - (vii) The faculty members by the Vice-Chancellor.
 - (viii) One of the concerned faculty members shall act as its convenor. The Pro-Vice-Chancellor will preside over the meeting to be convened after Vice-Chancellor.
3. The Academic Policy Committee shall do the following:
 - (i) To monitor academic aspects in all disciplines concerned and recommend for it.
 - (ii) To provide all fundamental aspects of academic policy referred to it by the Academic Council and any other committee, academic council of any Department /Institutes.
 - (iii) To consider and propose various measures for maximization and up-gradation of courses.
 - (iv) To submit reports on future proposals and activities.
 - (v) To suggest academic policy issued by GATEWAY State Government.
4. Board of Quality Management:
 - (i) The Board of Quality Management will comprise of the following members:
 - (i) The members appointed by the Governor
 - (ii) The members appointed by the Vice-Chancellor

(ii) Dean, Academic Affairs

(iii) Dean Student Management

(iv) Chair Finance & Audit Officer, Finance & Operations

(v) Registrar of the University

- (1.2) The functions of the Board of Study Management will include the following:
