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ORDINANCE 1

Admission of Students to the University and their Enrollment

Admission and Enrollment of students to the University shall be regulated in the manner hereinafter provided.

Definitions:

- (i) "Qualifying examination" means an examination the passing of which entitles a candidate eligible for admission to a particular course of study leading to a Bachelor, Master, M. Phil, Doctorate Degree or Diploma or Certificate conferred by the University.
- (ii) "Campus" means a school in which a student has been admitted 'School' as per subject by the concerned examining body i.e. a recognized Board of Secondary Education e.g. CBSE, ICSE, State Board of Secondary Education, etc. Such a student may be admitted pass (P.T.) - who scores required percentage of marks in the examination held subsequently by the same examining body and admitted fee.
- (iii) "Regulatory examination" means an regulatory examination conducted by:
 - (a) the concerned Board of Secondary Education or
 - (b) any school or College (University) or organization recognized by any statutory authority (not an Indian University recognized by any law or those for the time being and recognized by the University as equivalent to its corresponding examination.
- (iv) "Open period" means the period between the last date received an educational institution (including coaching Institutes) and the date of closing the applications to the University.

1. Eligibility for Admission:

- 1.1. Unless otherwise provided, no person shall be eligible for admission to the undergraduate courses of the University, unless he/she has passed the Indian School Certificate Examination or an Indian University or Board or an Examination recognized as equivalent or other of those Examinations by the Academic Council of the University three years or more.
- 1.2. Age where as provided, no person shall be qualified for admission to the undergraduate courses of the University, if he/she attains twenty-two years of age on the last day of October in the year or month for the entry admission.

In case of admission to the Post-Graduate courses of the University, if he/she attains twenty-eight years of age on the last day of October in the year or month for the entry admission. The above age maximum shall not apply for the Post-Doctoral Courses.
- 1.3. Provided further that the Vice-Chancellor may on the basis of individual merit, considering other the age limit up to a maximum period of five years.

- 1.6 The places shall be admitted to any postgraduate course, which includes the award of a PhD degree, on condition that the applicant is an undergraduate student or equivalent or a degree by the Academic Council has been awarded previously and further qualifications as may be prescribed by the University.
- 1.7 Provided that no places shall be eligible for admission to any post graduate course of the University which is the two year or three year degree course after Indian School Certificate (12th) Class.
- 1.8 The facilities relating admission to a course of study in the MATS University shall conform to the conditions provided for it by the Academic Council and published in the prospectus from time to time.
- 1.9 The maximum number of seats in each course shall be determined by the Academic Council from time to time having regard to the availability of adequate physical facilities.
- 1.10 The Qualifying Examination for admission to any course except Doctorates shall have any recognised University or any Central / State Government Board.

2. Admission for Admission

- 2.1 No admission shall be treated as class admission or a matter of right.
- 2.2 The procedure of admission shall be approved by the Academic Council from time to time and shall be published in the prospectus.
- 2.3 Any admission procedure of the University to admit graduate and post graduate courses shall be made in the light of such advice, except that, in an admission Directorate provided for the said purpose in such prospectus provided by the Academic Council from time to time.
- 2.4 Admission will be offered only when to an admission post or as provided by the Academic Council from time to time.
- 2.5 The application for admission shall among others be accompanied by (i) the actual or College Leaving Certificate issued to the student of the institution last attended by the student, (ii) that any of the conditions of such leaving that the applicant has passed the qualifying examination, and in the case of a student who passed the examination as private candidate, a certificate signed by the responsible person certifying to the principal authority of the applicant. If an applicant for admission is admitted, has passed the qualifying examination from a Board other than the Board of Secondary Education, Madhya Pradesh/Chattisgarh or a University other than the University, he shall submit an affidavit in the nature of college Leaving Certificate or equivalent or a Diploma Certificate from the University or Board of Secondary Education in the year when he registers with registration fee of Rs. 200/- (two hundred rupees) from time to time. If any of these are found to be legal, original or true, the student's admission will automatically stand successful and necessary regulations may be relaxed.

24. The mode of sending applications for admission of students can be direct / through counselling / through Institute website / through post / through Cambridge University, but students from India or abroad seeking admission in University can contact office with the University
25. The admission Committee will process the applications and admission holidays will be avoided provisional admission
26. A student who 'Completed' could only be granted 'Provisional' admission in any of the courses of study in which he / she would have otherwise normally been admitted. If in the last session of study the student
27. As the case of admission, every student and his/her parents or legal guardian shall be required to sign a declaration in the effect that the student admits himself/herself in the discipline & program / possession of the Vice-Chancellor and other authorities of the University
28. A student who has passed a part of any degree or diploma from another University Institution / organization or having been admitted in subsequent higher class for such institutions after the regulations have been formulated by the University Council
29. A student who wishes to be admitted after a gap period of one year or more, must shall comply with the regulations for admission subject as attached hereto. However, paying the amount of gap period and verifying that he / she had not taken admission in any institution / had not been matriculated / had not been matriculated in India or a relevant address in case of U.S. citizens of study, the provisional program is not open
30. The admission of the students shall be completed within a month of commencement of each semester every year on the date decided by the University Council
31. Provided that where the date specified in the above provided by the University Council, as the last date of admission begins or has to be later, the corresponding date will be the last date of admission
32. Provided further that the Vice-Chancellor shall have the powers to grant admission in cases of persons lacking beyond the last date of admission as given above on the date understanding that the admission of all such students shall be closed from the date of commencement of the course

3. Examination for admission in current semester

34. No student shall be admitted to any regular course simultaneously

22. Unless otherwise provided, a student may not purchase or otherwise obtain copies provided to the UICMA for digital requirements or preparation laid down for the program.
23. The student shall be admitted to a professional course after passing the same professional course at the University. Likewise, he/she may be admitted to a higher course of the same faculty provided to the UICMA for digital requirements.
24. The list of professional courses is provided in the Curriculum Chart Document that any Institute or Institute in the list of Professional Courses shall be accepted by the Academic Council, from time to time.
25. Anyone who has been suspended, cautioned, censured, expelled or by a competent authority of the UICMA University shall be prohibited from obtaining admission to any course elsewhere.
26. Admission to any course of the UICMA University may be cancelled, at any time, if any information furnished by the candidate is found to be false.
27. A candidate who has taken admission in any course as a full-time regular student will forfeit his/her right as an employee to the University and will not be allowed to appear in any Examination of the UICMA University as an employee.
28. A person who is under contract of service or has been disqualified from appearing in an examination by any other University / Institute will not be admitted in any course of study in the University during the period of his contract or disqualification.
29. The student enrolled in the university shall be admitted in any subsequent higher class in any Institute unless he / she has passed the examination qualifying for / her to appear for the examination for admission in the higher program.
30. The student registering from any other university shall be admitted in any class in an Institute unless he / she has passed the examination which has been declared by the university of registration or the qualifying examination for a student of the university.
31. If there is provision in the program provided in the sub clause 2.3 above, no student registering from any other university shall be admitted in any class in an Institute without the prior permission of the Institute obtained by the parent or legal guardian such as permanent, provisional.
32. An application for admission to a course leading to a Bachelor's Degree / Diploma course shall not be considered unless he / she is prepared to appear in all the subjects prescribed for the respective Degree / Diploma.
33. The student who has passed a part of any Degree in Two Sessions Examination from any other University shall be admitted in subsequent higher class for such an Examination in any Institute without the approval of the Vice-Chancellor or competent authority.

214. Candidates coming to examine from other Universities because of the trouble of their journey shall be exempt from the fee, and their lodging will be paid, admission to read the law also of education.
215. A student having admission to an institution after the commencement of the course shall be required to pay tuition and other fees for full course commencing from July / January of the year.

A. Examinations of Students:

41. Grad of certificate degree or higher shall confer the benefit of student who is provided free of cost all days from the last date of admission, along with all the relevant original documents and evidence he is qualified by the Academic Council from time to time.
42. The Transfer and Diploma Certificate awarded to students in the time of admission because the property of the MATT University.
43. Resident students will be issued own Transfer Certificate and Diploma Certificate under the seal of MATT University at the time of leaving the university.
44. The grades shall be obtained to any Examination of the MATT University, which he/she has been fully qualified as a student of the University.
45. If a student's a Diploma Certificate is provided University, He/She will transfer to Another University shall issue and submit the certificate and subsequently return with a Diploma Certificate from the University in which some other Examination of MATT University. First certificate and Evidence for in such cases shall be necessary.
46. The Register shall maintain a Register of all certified students studying in the various Faculties or Institutions or carrying the course work in the MATT University.
47. In the end register the Register shall be reported to university at regular interval regarding the student including the date of admission and during the sessions and finally after course completion of degree Diploma certificate awarded to him/her.
48. The student shall be informed, as mentioned, the result number table which his/her name has been entered in the Register and that number be given to the student in all communications with the University and in subsequent applications for admission in the institutions of the MATT University.
49. All applications for admission in the University Institutions shall be forwarded with reference to the Registrar's Office. The Controller of Examinations may refuse the application of a candidate whose other complete particulars have not been furnished and require him/her to submit a complete statement of his particulars and documents together within the prescribed time limit.

- 4.12 Any enrolled student may obtain a certified copy of the student's record by applying to the Academic Department president or his/her president's designee.
- 4.13 A student shall be enrolled as a member of an institution, as stated in 14.1, as is selected by the Academic Committee. List of the institutions and fees paid for enrollment fees.

5. Change of Name

- 5.1 A student applying for the change of his/her name in the Register of enrolled departments shall submit his/her application in the Register through the Dean of his faculty concerned as the Head of the institution, accompanied by
- The prescribed fee.
 - An affidavit stating in full his present and proposed name, full, exact birth date, parents of a daughter by father given by guardian, in case female is named as by himself/parent, in case both a couple.
 - A publication from a newspaper in which the proposed change of name has been announced. However, the procedure relating to publications shall not be applicable in case where a woman's maiden name is changed for name following her marriage.

The Register on receiving such applications and after necessary checks shall report to the Academic Council.

6. Change of Subjects

- 6.1 A student shall not voluntarily be allowed to change the approved academic requirements (majority of a course), unless the same is applied for and approved within three weeks from the date of admission. Such applications should be submitted to the Dean of the Faculty with the consent of the Head(s) of the Department(s) concerned.

7. Continuation for students in various categories or students who, students who, technology and gifts programs

- 7.1 A student belonging to students with various needs, technology and gifts programs shall be admitted every year on the terms, conditions and provisions prescribed by the corresponding laws and/or rules.

7.2 In case of any difficulty regarding or issues relating to admission of various students, the decision shall be the Vice-Chancellor shall be final.

8. Admissions Procedures

- 8.1 There shall be an Admissions Committee headed by Academic Committee for U. and Post-graduate, Bachelor, Diploma and Certificate Courses in each Faculty/Institution for applying for admission to the WU/TC/University.

12. The Committee shall:

- (i) Examine the applications from the candidates of the candidates in accordance with the conditions of admission provided by the Academic Council from time to time.
 - (ii) Direct the Admission Tests (and/or Interviews) as an admission procedure.
 - (iii) After the completion of the Admission Tests, call from each category candidates from among the number of seats available for admission in the course concerned.
- Provided that not more candidates shall be called for interview, who have obtained at least 50% marks in the Admission Tests.
- (iv) Degree the marks be based on the marks obtained by the candidates in the Admission Tests and/or Interviews.
 - (v) Degree a list of the candidates selected for postgraduate admission as is contained in the Memorandum of the Committee to the Director of the Faculty concerned.
 - (vi) Be duly bound to regulate admissions as is consistent with the principles laid down for the said purpose by the Academic Council from time to time.
 - (vii) Regulate matters regarding eligibility and residence of the candidates as may be required.
13. The members of the Committee other than ex-officio members shall hold office for a term of one academic year.
14. The Admission Committee shall be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor according to the regulations from time to time.
15. The Admission Committee may accept any more than three members of the Departmental Committees representing different areas of specialization under admission in the Faculty.
16. Not less than three-fourth of total number of members of the Committee shall form the quorum.

4. Admission of International Students:

- 17. **Director:** There shall be a Director to facilitate the procedure to be followed for the eligibility and admission of international students in various courses of UGC Degree.
- 18. **Office:** There shall be an International Student Cell set up in the college with assistance and guidance of international students. The Cell will not only assist the admission of the students but will also provide necessary guidance and counseling for staying overseas. 22

Letter regarding the international students should be addressed to the International Student Liaison of the Institution.

6.3. International Students: Under the Guidelines, International Student will include the following:

- i. **Foreign students:** Student holding passport issued by foreign countries including people of Indian origin who have acquired the nationality of foreign countries are included as foreign students.
- ii. **Non Resident Indian (NRI):** Only those Non Resident Indian students who have studied one year in the qualifying examination from outside in colleges in foreign countries will be included as international students. This will include the students studying in the schools or colleges situated in foreign countries even if affiliated to the Boards of Secondary Education or Councils board in India, but will not include students studying in those schools or colleges (situated in India) not affiliated to the Boards of Secondary Education or Councils of the foreign countries. Students passing the qualifying examination from Boards or Councils located in foreign countries is a normal student and dependent of NEET studying in India will not be included as international student.

They will not come of International students as they in the country will be included.

6.4. Documents required for admission of International Student:

- i. **Yes:** All the international student will require evidence not confined to this institution for passing full time course. To take admission in institute, students seeking to join a research programme will require a research visa obtained in that institution. The visa should be valid for the prescribed duration of the course. A visa is not required for NEET students. Students who are doing NEET course in some other countries, do not require a separate visa for joining purpose course provided that their course course valid for the entire duration of the course.
- ii. **No Overseas Certificate:** Students no longer require a Certificate Overseas for joining professional course. (This has been withdrawn by the Government of India vide letter No. S.116.11-1/2020-4 dated 28th August 2020).
All international student seeking to undertake any research programme in Ph.D or M.Phil. programmes will have to obtain their research visa from the Ministry of External Affairs and the approval of Department of Secondary & Higher Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India and this must be on the document submitted in the institution.

6.2. **Eligibility Qualifications.** The qualifications required for eligibility for admission to different courses are set out in detail here in the prospectus. Only those students who have qualified from foreign Universities or Boards of Higher Education, recognized or equated by the Government of India (Government/UGC) are eligible for admission. Please refer to a prospectus will be made for ALL students for applications.

6.3. **Admission of International Students.** Admission of the international students will be done through the International Student Cell of the University. The student will generally be admitted to the University of the course. However, students can also be admitted as transfer students to the middle of the course from other countries if the candidate is eligible. The admission of international students is done in two steps. Thus, a student wishing to join the Institute, give the application form and the documents as per the eligibility requirements, course available and admission procedure from the prospectus at the website of the Institution. The application for provisional admission is then submitted to the Department, Institute Cell along with the processing fees. The Cell will then check the eligibility and issue the provisional admission letter. This is required to get the visa and to complete other formalities.

After getting provisional admission, the student should get the student visa and complete all other formalities. The student should then appear for their examination in the Institute where he/she came to join the course. The next step is to fill up the admission form from the concerned Institute and pay the required fees. After this, the student should undergo the medical examination. The student may have to appear for the English proficiency test conducted by themselves or some other agency. Once this is done, the final admission is given.

The international students will have to pay the fee in USD dollars. In special cases, provision will be given for payment of fees to the respective Indian Region. Following that an amount payable in course provisional admission. Some fees included in the cost of tuition, if purchased, English Proficiency admission fee (which is different for each programme and for separate course).

6.4. **Exemptions from English.** In addition, the students will have to pay the tuition and other fees as prescribed by the Institution. Students who are required to take the proficiency test in English or undergo the Institution course will have to pay the prescribed fees as applicable. This will have to be paid after the student are finally admitted. To the extent fees were or would have been paid in some, the student have not yet take the admission to the course after obtaining provisional admission, the fee abatement/fee will be refunded after including the bank charges and charges as applicable.

An international student who has been granted admission to any of the courses after passing the qualifying examination from a statutory Board or Governmently Institute shall have to

appear at the Institute) Test in English conducted by the Institute or any other examination concerned, unless you have passed the qualifying examination in the English section on a separate basis (i.e.)

An international student who takes part in the Institute Test in English at any of the above or the test shall be required to join the International English Centre for International students (IIEC) at the Institute as prescribed by the Institute.

The Institute will continue the course and fees will have to be suitably adjusted for IIEC as International Centre, at the college.

IIEC has especially been accepted as English Language Centre to meet the needs of students who want to improve their proficiency in the English language. This course can be done simultaneously with the other regular course as stipulated.

10. **Transfer & Change of Course:** An international student who has been granted admission in a particular course shall not be allowed to change the course. Transfer from one Institute in India to another or from one allowed category to recognized ones, the International Institute will permit this – based on the availability of the course, eligibility rules and guidelines of the Director, Institute of the Institute.

11. **Continuation of Study facilities:** International students who are awarded scholarships by the IIEC New Delhi shall be given preferential treatment while granting admission and the board recommendations. Special facilities like different foreign governments for training, studies and research can also be granted to the same.

12. **Approval procedure for admission of International students for full time courses.**

- Step 1: Student must purchase the International Institute's Bulletin (containing the eligibility requirements) prepared by the Institute. The information is also available on the website.
- Step 2: Fill up the eligibility form for international students and submit it along with the copies of documents listed in the Eligibility form and the required fees. This should be done well in time so that the student is able to submit the form and IIEC before the due date of admission.
- Step 3: Go for provisional admission form from the International Institute, IIEC with the course fee etc.
- Step 4: Show Admittance to the Indian Embassy, to the respective country and get a letter also submitted to concerned IIEC students on successful completion.

Step 2: Report to the institution for admission. Fill the previous admission form and submit it with the following documents (in original along with a Dutch copy):

- a. Degree: Diploma Certificate of the qualifying examination
- b. Made list of qualifying examination
- c. Institute visa (original)
- d. A Dutch copy of that passport (not needed if a return)

Note: The original certificate will be returned to the student immediately after making an admission to the office.

Step 3: Complete the medical examination and get the medical fitness certificate. In your passport, add all international vaccine markings (both an institute visa here as to land the EU) and a red seal in your admission if found to be possible. All international vaccine will be required to get medical form of IS 5.26, which includes the medical certificate given by the first year. The subsequent (non-the medical certificate) but not to enter as the other labels marking and is indicated in other steps.

Step 4: Agree for the preliminary use in English if any as per admission requirement of the Institute. This is only applicable if the qualifying examination is done in the English medium.

Step 5: Admission of international students will be confirmed only after verification of original certificate, medical fitness certificate and payment of required fee.

Step 6: Write a letter of intent to India require their names with the police in the Foreign Regional Registration Office (FRRO) at the local Police.

International students who are not paying for all visa require to use other documents and to give admission a just time reason to depart: education matters only if they hold a valid visa for the duration of the course. A request visa is not required. They will pay the fee as applicable. The institution may submit such cases directly for its consideration with international students Cell if they meet the prescribed regulatory guidelines.

8.11: **Discipline:** The international students will abide by all the rules of Institute and the code of conduct as applicable to Indian students during their course.

8.12: **Examination and Award of Degrees, Diplomas & Certificates:** The previous fee certificate, previous admission form, issue of work visa, date of passing residence and award of diploma will be used as for the degree request during their course.

8.13: **Conditions:** The above rules will be applicable for admissions that take the name of their rules. In case, there are any differences in the interpretation of rules then the opinion of the International Students Cell will be final. The fees are liable to increase and students will have to pay the revised fees when applicable. On the points are specifically covered, the decision of

- 11. **Examination** : Candidates seeking the qualifications will be allowed to selected courses subject to the guidelines laid and subject knowledge will be required in the chosen subject which will lead to meeting, research, and to academic purposes. In addition to conventional subjects like Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Botany, Zoology, more recent subjects such as Non-linear & Technology, Information Technology, Software Engineering, Biochemistry, Microbiology, Bioinformatics and Computer Science will be considered as B. Sc. level.
Candidates may also be given a M.Sc. - II (2) programme in the last two semesters provided the candidate holds all the required qualifications.
- 12. **Term** : Minimum of Term (18 Mo.)
- 13. **Faculty** : Faculty of Life Sciences / Sciences
- 14. **Duration** : Two Years (in four semesters)

III. General: It is further provided to be noted, the decision of the Vice-Chancellor of the University shall be final. However, as the recommendation of the Academic Council, the Vice-Chancellor will be required to accept the recommendations of the Council.

In case of any dispute, the matter shall be decided under the jurisdiction of the Director/Dean Degree.

ORDINANCE IV

Structure of Computer Applications (BCA)

171. Objective: Education Technology today is regarded as a structure of knowledge and also a critical reality not for controlling, governing and profiting

all other spheres of knowledge. It is also recognized that while even the information technology is going to change every facet of human existence, not all will be technology based career. It is recognized that in future the career plus point there will be demand of more ill able computer professionals and with the availability of present educational facilities, the time will not be in the range of one-11 lakh. Therefore there is a need to alter up IT education programmes as a big one.

There are three basic skill levels for an IT professional. The first level is that of an operator, the second is of a programming assistant or a programmer and the third is of a system analyst or a manager. There are very clearly required in the changing IT scenario in the world which include web designing, handling of internet based information and programming for the embedded environment. The required skills also include business mathematics, processing and modeling.

The course will provide them with a depth knowledge in the various domains of ability computer as their profession. Each student will be given freedom in the field, such as the required and unrequired areas, industry and educational institutions.

- 11.3. **Special** – In all matters pertaining to the tenure, the duties of the Vice-Chancellor of the University shall be final. However, in the communication of the Academic Council, the Vice-Chancellor shall be empowered to change the course or portion of examination. The papers are subject to change from time to time as specified by the Academic Council/ Board of Studies. In case of any dispute, the matter shall be decided under provisions of Central Cases Regulations.

APPENDIX III

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY (Ph.D.)

The Degree of Doctor of Philosophy (Ph. D.) may be obtained in any faculty/ Division of the University subject to general guidance of the Academic Council and general control of the faculty concerned. Research studies for Ph. D. shall be supervised by the respective Faculty Degree Committee/ Head of Division.

Eligibility:

1. A candidate for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy must, at the time of application, hold University degree with at least 45% marks (40% marks for 2007 candidates and onwards), and usually, be a highly qualified candidate or an equivalent grade of B. Phil. degree of the University, a Special University or any other University recognized by any law for the time being in force and recognized by the University.
2. Provided that a candidate who has at least 7 years experience of research or teaching experience of five years teaching with at least 5 papers published in standard research journals, may be permitted to get registered for Ph. D. degree, even if he/she does not possess B.Phil. marks in the Designation degree.

3. Provided that the candidate having a least 21st grade in B.Tech. (E. or equivalent after five semesters) with 1 year's experience of working in a firm/industry; and in regard to experience in DE 2, in Instrumentation Engineering.
4. It will be the responsibility of the candidate to cause for his eligibility and withdrawal of such other candidate to pay the prescribed fee/expense in the rules and regulations of the University. The expenses in DE 2 will be subject to a maximum of one and a half per cent of the gross salary of the candidate to be drawn by the candidate before the submission of application form. The candidate is requested to ascertain that, how from the concerned Department.

Further there are several fee shall be mentioned prior to the application for P.E. Study qualifying the candidate will be required to submit a certificate of payment for registered in DE 2 in the department concerned. If the fee not paid till the document back return.

Eligible category: One-year courses, 21/20 degree holders, DEET / GATE qualified candidates will be accepted from the outside also.

The candidate on employment will have to submit his Expense Certificate (EC) from that Employer.

5. A candidate may apply for registration for B.O. degree of BA / BA degree as the prescribed fees, available at payment of prescribed fee, namely:

(i) fee for qualifications and experience;

(ii) salary in arrears for the progress in work;

(iii) the scale or type of sanctioned work;

(iv) name of the supervisor (along with the name of Co-supervisor, if any) under whom he/she will be working and the place/place at which he/she has to carry out his assignments together with the period of the experience and Co-experience, if any.

The application must also be accompanied by the following items:

(a) Application form

(b) A certificate from the Head of the University Teaching Department or the Principal of the National Centre of the University or Head of a Research Institute concerned for the purpose for the University certifying that applicant fulfills rules and certify that the Head of the University Teaching Department or the Principal or the Head of the Research Institute will, in case the candidate is granted, not place the candidate on work in BA / BA degree or salary or pension under the supervision of his present employer/contracted in the application.

(5) A detailed report of the work done/paid during of the year's degree programme and M. Phil degree programme, stipends and expenses incurred wherever necessary should be enclosed with the application. Application for extension may be submitted any time during the academic year.

(6) A resolution from the House of Deans or the Council of the University when the candidate is present for the semester work that he/she has paid the following fees/commitment fees, be enclosed:

- (i) Tuition fee
- (ii) Library fee
- (iii) Library membership or gas provision of the institute
- (iv) Hostel and mess
- (v) Laboratory Fee
- (vi) Laboratory material money
- (vii) Development Fee

(7) After payment of fees along with the completed application form the candidate will be provisionally admitted.

The candidate has application is found to be in order or being recommended by a Dean of the faculty appointed by the Vice-Chancellor.

8. After all details of the application, the candidate shall be eligible to submit a synopsis of the proposed research work along with the title of thesis or minor project. All submitted by the candidate and Dean of the Institute/college for candidate's meeting. He shall be required to make an oral presentation of the proposed work before the Research Degree Committee (RDC) consisting of the following members:

- (i) Vice-Chancellor or his nominee
- (ii) Dean of the concerned faculty
- (iii) Head of University Teaching Department in the subject
- (iv) Chairman, Board of Studies in the subject
- (v) One invited subject expert of the work of University/Institute to be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor with the aid of a panel of subject panel by the Chairman of the Board of Studies.

The internal report and the other material shall form the portfolio.

Note: (1) On the request of the applicant, the Department may permit the candidate to be present at an interview during the oral presentation of his candidate to EOC meeting.

(2) The T.A. & D.A. shall be present at the candidate and the supervisor for conducting the Research Degree Committee meeting.

4. The meeting of the Research Degree Committee shall be held at the University Office either a year previously to February and October. The committee shall assess the eligibility of the person to the appointment as Supervisor/Supervisor. The committee shall also prepare a list of approved Supervisors/Supervisors along with their specializations as per provision of the candidate for the Ph.D. degree.

On approval by the EOC the candidate shall be registered and enrolled as a student from the date the Head of the Department / College / Institute forwarded the application in the form in which the candidate deposits the application fee, wherever it is laid. He / She will also be required to pay regular tuition, library and laboratory fees (as applicable) during the research tenure.

Provided that the EOC does not recommend a candidate for appointment as Ph.D. degree, the candidate may be reported by the committee that is a failed.

5. A candidate shall normally be permitted to work for Ph.D. degree in the subject in which he/she has obtained his/her master's degree.

However the applicant with holding in Ph. D. degree may be allowed to attend subject of interdisciplinary nature at the same faculty or at other faculty in such cases the candidate may have to present a valid certificate or certificate of approval, along with the application.

6. A candidate shall possess the required in the institution from which he / her application form has been forwarded under section 7(b) of the Ordinance.

However if a candidate provided in work in a research establishment recognized by the University shall be required to take at least one co-supervisor along with the supervisor, one of them should be the teacher of the University and the other a Teacher Education Institute/Director of Institute where the candidate is actually working.

Provided that a candidate may be permitted to carry out his/her research work in a Research Institute/Research Lab/Library of a University recognized by the University for the purpose with the approval of a University Director/Dean of the Institute where he / she may or may not be the Co-supervisor of the candidate.

7. The person responsible for the registration of the research scholar must be:

- (i) a Faculty Grade Lecturer or a University Teaching Department or an Institute (as may be notified) or any University possessing a doctoral degree and has published five research papers in reputed national journals.

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- (ii) A member of the University Teaching Department or a faculty, affiliated to any University who has secured a Doctorate degree in the subject and published seven research papers in reputed national journals and has other three year teaching experience after PhD.

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- (iii) (a) A Research Scholar Degree holder or a research scholar, experienced researcher/lecturer, employed in the University at a research centre, who has obtained a doctoral degree and published 1 research paper or research article in reputed national journals and has 7 year post doctoral research experience.

(b) The person responsible for registration of guide research scholar together with Registrar must be: A member - Research Section of any University, Research Institutions who has obtained a Doctorate degree, and has published at least five research papers in reputed national journals with 7 year post doctoral research experience.

(c) A research scholar who fails to publish any research paper over a duration of five years shall not be eligible to avail any research scholar under his supervision. Provided that the person who has a dual assignment as supervisor. Co-supervisor shall be eligible as supervisor over other research scholar.

The candidate who has been recognized as eligible Co-supervisor under the special provision shall continue to be recognized eligible Co-supervisor provided further that a person who is below equivalent to PhD degree of any University shall not be eligible to act as Supervisor/Co-supervisor or holder of any research scholar in the University.

- (d) The candidate shall pursue the research at the approved place of research under the Supervisor/Co-supervisor on the approved subject. The candidate shall be provided at least twelve months respite before the 24 months and not more than three calendar years from the date of registration. If one or multiple dates are taken before three or five calendar years from the date of registration and date not apply for extension or term his/her registration shall stand automatically cancelled. Provided that the period for achievement of thesis can be extended by one year by the Vice-Chancellor. If the one applies for extension should not exceed before the expiry of the registration period expires with a fee of Rs. 10000/- as the condition that

8. The candidate may be allowed to change the Supervisor by the Vice-Chancellor on the recommendations of the committee constituted by the Vice-Chancellor for this purpose under special circumstances. 14 days advance in the name of request will be provided for in the change of supervisor.
 9. The University shall charge the cost of books, journal of candidates, postage of the paper and a program report for cost of the Institute library through his/her supervisor.

The Research Institute will make annual presentation of the work done by the candidate to D.R.C. If the work is found satisfactory by the D.R.C. the Institute which may be allowed to proceed for each subject the D.R.C. within three months and upon if the progress of work is quite found satisfactory the matter will be reported by the Chairman, D.R.C. to the Vice-Chancellor for completion of registration of the candidate's scholar. If the progress of work is not found satisfactory in two successive reports or no reports are received for a period of one year and the candidate fails to appear for the exam, the Vice-Chancellor may cancel the contract with regard to the scholar from the list of those registered for the Ph.D. degree.

10. (a) The candidate shall submit an original copy of the summary of the thesis together with a list of research paper published, communicated for publication, if any, through his supervisor to the Registrar during three months prior to the anticipated date of submission of thesis.
- (b) The supervisor shall submit a panel of at least six names of members actively engaged in the concerned area of research to advise the work of thesis or Library Reference is a related copy to the Registrar. Provided that the panel of members shall be obtained from the West University Teaching Department Chairman, Board of Studies of the Institute concerned. It can be modified as advised to the supervisor.
- (c) On the receipt of the panel of members from the Registrar and summary from the candidate, the Director of Examinations / Registrar shall call a meeting of Examinations Committee of the subject constituted by the Academic Council. The Committee consisting the panel nominated by the Department/Chair, University Teaching Department, Chairman, Board of Studies will prepare a panel of six names to sit as examiners. The Vice-Chancellor shall appoint a research committee one of the panel of six members.

 - (d) The candidate shall also submit the questionnaire for along with the photo.
13. A copy of the photo along with the passport and the it shall be sent to the committee along submitted as per para 11(2) of the Guidelines.
14. The photo to be accepted for the award of the BCI degree shall comply with the following conditions:
 - (a) It must be a photo of recent work characterized either by the Secretary of the State or by a bank approval to verify the authenticity of date in which case it should cover the candidate's request for initial examination and award/passage.
 - (b) It must be satisfactory in terms of background and presentation of the subject matter.
15. The candidate shall completely questionnaire to be provided preferred to be prepared by the candidate himself and approved by the head of management responsible to submit in support of the photo together with detailed comments on the points specified in in clause 14 of the Commission. The candidate must also give a list of the questions if he is unable to be asked at the time of viva-voce examination.
 - (a) The questionnaire may seek clarification of the subject matter at the time when the Department. The questionnaire will be incorporated in the form to be used in the examination unless during the exam.
 - (b) The Vice-Chancellor can recall the candidate from an examinee who fails to read the paper within three months of the date of dispatch of the photo and appear under no return.
17. (a) If any both the candidate rejects the photo or one of them rejects the photo and the other questionnaire is returned, the photo shall be rejected.

12. If the candidate mentioned that he wishes to obtain a master's degree in the future, the Vice-Chancellor shall grant the candidate to continue his study on either full or part-time basis. In such cases, the period being covered from the date of the issue of order to the candidate. The candidate shall be provided a student's register without charging the amount of the amount to enable him/her to acquire the books. One copy of the books shall also be provided to the candidate.

It shall be notified to the candidate that he/she will have to pay a fee after the end of the time of enrollment, but a shall not be necessary for him to represent any certificate of further enrollment or his residence or that he is the correct party to the claim.

14. The research scholar shall join any other course (MEd) or appear at any other examination conducted by any University, Institute or Higher Group Certificate/ Diploma Course of Language, Research Methodology, Statistics, Computer Courses.

2. The thesis shall be published only with the permission of the University and such publication shall not be for sale, pay, or for the use of those appointed for the award of the Ph.D. Degree of the University.
 3. Like the manuscript, the correspondence of the examinee shall be referred to the Academic Council for the award of the Ph.D. degree to the Candidate. One Copy of the thesis will be kept in the university library and another copy will be kept in the Departmental Library of the University after the research work was carried out. The third will be retained in the department.
 4. Like the submission of the result, the successful candidates may be provided the copies of reports of examinee who was successful for the award of the degree in printed form of the thesis. The report will not declare the identity of the examinee.
 5. The candidates who have been already registered for Ph.D. Degree under the regular admission will continue to be governed by the provisions of the original Ordinance.
- The candidates who have applied the requirement but have not been registered till this ordinance comes into force shall be governed by the provisions of the Ordinance.
6. On issuance of pay regularly, the University shall also provide stipend to students who degree is not provision of Article 1 (2) of the ordinance.

ORDINANCE 27

Award of Degree, Diploma, Certificate and Other Academic Distinctions

1. The candidate who passes the examination provided for a particular certificate, diploma or degree shall become entitled to the award of the said certificate, diploma or degree respectively as the case may be.
2. The Degree shall give the names of all the successful candidates for the award of certificate, diploma or degree before the Academic Council take into the consideration of the results. On approval by the Academic Council, the Provisional Certificate, Diploma and Degree shall be issued to the respective candidates by the University.
3. The Certificate, Diploma and Degree shall be signed by the Vice-Chancellor.
4. The approval accorded by the Academic Council for the award of the Certificate, Diploma, Degree or any other distinction or award shall be placed before the Board of Management for its consideration. On being sanctioned by the Board of Management, the Certificate, Diploma and Degree shall be awarded to the successful candidates in due season.
5. The certificate of the Degree / Diploma / Certificate that reads as enclosed by the University under different Department / Institute / Centre is shown in the Schedule 2A - I.

ORDINANCE 28

The Conditions for the Award of Fellowships and Scholarships, Bursaries, Stipends and Prizes

2. (a) Every year the Governor shall make appointments through advertisement in every year for the award of the Fellowships, Scholarships and Studentship Scholarships.
 - (b) All awards of Fellowships, Research Scholarships and other stipendiaries shall be made on the recommendations of the committee consisting of:
 - (i) The Chancellor — Chairman
 - (ii) The Vice-Chancellor — Member
 - (c) Three Extra of Faculty / Departments appointed by the Board of Management / Academic Council may have:
 - (i) The Degree — Member Ex-officio
3. Subject to the general conditions applicable to all Degrees, Fellowships and Stipendiaries as laid down in paragraph 4 below, the rules, duration and conditions for the award of all India Fellowships shall be such as are laid down by the University Study Commission - CSIR - IIT / IISER / Other Regulatory Bodies.
4. The rules and details of Fellowships / Stipendiaries awarded by the Governing body of the University shall be laid down by the Academic Council and approved by the Board of Management. The issuance of the certificate shall be made in accordance with the regulations laid down by the Board of Management from time to time.
 - (i) The Fellow / Student will be eligible for Research Work under an approved guide or a subject approved by the UGC / Council.
 - (ii) The Fellow / Student shall not accept or hold any appointments public or private or receive any emolument, salary, stipend or fees or other income during the tenure of the award but shall enjoy benefit / reward in any profession or trade during the period. On any income, emolument, salary, stipend or other income that may be received a total of the conditions, when he is working without accepting any appointment.
 - (iii) The Fellow / Student shall not join any other course of study or degree in any institution after commencing work under the Fellowship / Stipendiary.

Provided that the Chancellor may, on the recommendation of the guide, permit the Fellow / Student to join a Language / Computer / Diploma Course and appear in an examination thereon.

Provided further that temporary staff as provided for above also shall not be appointed as an incumbent in a definite position in the positions of permanent nature applying for a depot.

- (b) Unless provided by the rules in force for a specified period or years after close the Fellow-Scholar shall be required to attend the Institute, when he is in work or off working days.
- (c) If any information submitted by the Fellow-Scholar in the application is found to be incorrect, irregular or misleading, the award may be annulled by the Academic Council after giving him opportunity of being heard.
- (d) If at any time it should appear to the University that the progress or conduct of the Fellow-Scholar has not been satisfactory, the Fellowship/Continuing may be suspended or withdrawn by the Academic Council/Examining Commission.
- (e) (i) The leave for a maximum of Thirty Days in a year, in addition to general holiday may be taken by a Fellow-Scholar with the approval of the post with the MCI University. The general holidays, however, do not include the vacation period e.g. summer, Christmas, Diwali and Chinese New Year. The same leave with Fellow-Scholar shall be applicable.

Provided that the vacation provision shall be subject to University Laws & Regulations being passed on receiving Three Months prior during the term of the award.

- (f) The Fellow-Scholar may, in special case, be elected by the MCI University to receive various Fellowship/Continuing for a period not exceeding Three Months during the term of the award or the commencement of the post.

- (g) The Fellow-Scholar shall be required to pay the fee provided by the Institute when he visits.

- 4. Institute and Departmental Fellowships provided by the University shall continue to remain the responsibility of the Institute in the first year and six months in the second year to ascertain for the scholarship holder progress & position of standing in studies from the Head of the Department in the subject of study.
- 5. The scholarship shall be awarded from the 1st of August of the scholarship holder year the award unless the award of the date of the opening of the University College after the previous vacation and pays the award fee from the commencement of the session. In any other case, it shall be made from the date on which the candidate joins the course.
- 6. A scholarship shall be continued in the subsequent year when a scholarship holder fails to attend a least 75% marks in the Institute Examinations of the concerned course.
- 7. If a scholarship holder is unable to appear at the previous examination on account of sickness or any other reasonable cause, the scholarship shall be paid only if the Head of the Institute certifies that the

ORDINANCE 28

The University Examination

CHAPTER I

ARTICLE 1

11. Academic Examinations means a programme of courses leading to any other completed leading to a Bachelor's degree, Honours degree, Postgraduate and Research degrees, M. Phil, Ph. D Degree and certificate.
12. An Academic Year is a period of nearly 11 months devoted to the completion of programmes specified in the syllabus on Teaching and the related examinations.
13. Examinations means a programme of tests and analysis, year is approved by the academic staff of the faculty.
14. Course means a component of the academic programme, carrying a distinctive title or code specific to the course taught.
15. External examiner means an examiner who is not in the employment of the University or its constituent constituent agencies.
16. Internal Examiner means an examiner who is in the employment of the University or its constituent constituent agencies
 - (a) In case of theory papers, an examiner including a paper holder who is a member of the University, Department/Study Centre or Institute attached to the University or its bodies.

- 10. In case of practical and viva-voce examination, an examinee who is a holder of the University, Department, Study Centre or Institute where candidate was being examined in the examination centre:
 - 10.1. An examinee means a candidate who writes paper other than the paper under
 - 10.2. Institute where a paper is held in the Department of the University and an assistant examination officer in any of the examination programmes in which the University is approved.
 - 10.3. Degree Certificate where a paper who has passed regular course of study in the UG/PG University, Training Department or Incentives/extension and such admission is also a candidate of the UG/PG University as such.
 - 10.4. An examinee means a candidate who was admitted to an examination by a regular candidate and was not admitted afterwards because of the fact that it appears in the examination through admission card was already issued to him by the UG/PG University and such admission given to the said examination.
 - 10.5. UG/PG Candidate means a candidate who failed in not more than two papers in the University Examination and is appearing in the Examination of some semester apart which is approved with the Vice-Chancellor, University.
 - 10.6. Second ATKT Candidate means a candidate who has failed in not more than two papers in the Institute End Examination and failed again in two (two papers) in the Examinations conducted with the Vice-Chancellor, University and who is appearing for the second and final time in other than papers with the regular Institute End Examinations of the same semester reported for the conduct of the next batch (i.e. junior batch, third batch or later) for re-admission.
 - 10.7. A regular course of study means regular course of study in a University, Training Department or Incentives/extension in such degree which candidate entered in after the examination.
 - 10.8. The Institute shall have to fill the following requirements of candidates as follows:

Chapter - II

1. University Examination

- 1.1. The University shall have a committee for all such academic programmes as are approved by the Academic Council and as it may modify from time to time for awarding Bachelor's Degree's degree, Undergraduate Post-graduate degree and certificate, as the case may be, as per the prescribed syllabus of Teaching & Examination and Syllabi as are approved by the Academic Council.
- 1.2. Examinations of the University shall be open to a person resident in the University.

Provided that the Academic Council may allow any other category of candidates to enter the University Examination for any specified academic programme subject to the fulfillment of such conditions as may be laid down by the Academic Council from time to time.

- 1.3. No person who has been expelled or debarred from the University or has been debarred from appearing at the University Examination shall be admitted to any Examination during the period for which the person is so expelled.

Provided further that a student may be admitted after appearing in the examination and commencing his or her study of candidates and other persons as provided in any other Ordinance of the University.

2. PROGRAMME CONTENT & EVALUATION

- 2.1. A Bachelor's Degree's degree, M. The Degree and Undergraduate Post-graduate degree programmes shall comprise of a number of courses and or other components as specified in the syllabus of Teaching & Examination and Syllabi of the concerned programme, as are approved by the Academic Council. Each course shall be assigned a weightage in terms of specified Credit Grade from time to time.
- 2.2. The minimum point required for completion of a programme shall be as specified in the syllabus of Teaching & Examination and Syllabi of the concerned programme.
- 2.3. The maximum permissible period for completing a programme for which the prescribed programme duration is a semester shall be 1.5 semester. All the programme requirements shall have to be completed within 1.5 semester.

3. RESIDENTS

- 3.1. An academic year shall be applicable into two sessions. Each of the two sessions shall be of a working duration of about 12 weeks.

The Academic Calendar shall be revised by the University each year, before the start of academic courses.

A. Submission of Student Marks

The results of assignments, Class tests and attendance shall be submitted to the Committee of Examinations at least one week before the commencement of Examinations. The internal marks should carry prominent weightage of Class test, Assignments and Attendance.

B. Admission to the University Examinations

1) All the students for promotion to degree in any of the Examinations of the University shall have to fill up the prescribed examination Forms and forwarded to the Committee of Examinations through the Dean of the Faculty/Head of the concerned Institute/Department.

2) In forwarding the applications of the Regular Students, the Dean of the Faculty/the Head of the Institute or School concerned shall verify:

- (i) That the candidate has obtained marks by the professor at the Institute from a complete subject that is the first part of Examinations, which qualifies him/her for admission to the next Examination.
- (ii) That the candidate has studied a requisite amount of credit for the period prescribed and has to attend 80% attendance requirements.
- (iii) That he/she has studied a satisfactory.
- (iv) Certificate of his/her 11 (ii) above will be provisional and can be withdrawn in any case before the Examinations, if the applicant fails to attend the prescribed percentage of lectures, tutorials, practicals, T.O.C, projects etc. unless he/she has University exam.

 - 1.2.4. criteria by the Ontario College of Education regarding the course;

- 1.3. When a candidate offers an additional subject for an examination in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinance relating to the examination, the minimum standard requirement shall apply equally in case of such additional subject.

A candidate shall produce his Admission Card whenever required by the Superintendent of the Examination Centre.
- 1.12. In the Examination Hall, the candidate shall be under the disciplinary control of the Superintendent of the Centre and he shall not bring any other materials in the event of a candidate disobeying the provisions of the Ordinance or his authorized officer or officer who is in charge of the Examination or any discipline. The candidate may be excluded from the University's Examination and if he/she persists in disobedience he may be excluded from the use of the Examination by the Superintendent of the Examination. - d) A minimum of two assignments per subject per semester will be given to the students.
- e) Each student will be required to fulfill the assignment after submission through a personal assignment system.
- f) Assignments will be prepared as per a standard format approved by the Academic Council. Assignments to one specific or different departments.
- g) Student will be required to submit the assignments within two weeks from the date of issue.
- h) Assignments submitted after the due date will not be assessed for more than 10% marks.

The minimum thesis for class's degree programme, which is specified in the syllabus, the evaluation shall be done and marks awarded by a Committee comprising of at least members, one will normally be the supervisor and two or more external examiners. Conditions under (b) above shall apply to parties a medical condition from the Medical Officer, MAU University.

11.2. The Council of Examinations, in carrying out its functions and in the exercise of its powers of Examinations, will comply with the requirements of its members and shall advise the Department of Examinations accordingly.

11.3. The University shall have power to award qualifications from its constituent colleges.

14. The Superintendent of Examinations shall accept for a private candidate for the desired examination and appoint a Special Scriber from the list supplied by the Office of the Controller of Examinations.
15. The date here will be given at the time candidate receives all the details.
16. The convenience in the examination will be given to the Office of the Controller of Examinations in the coming year if any.

22. Higher Criteria for AICTE candidates

- 22.1. The following shall be eligible to appear in AICTE examination
 - (a) Candidate who has failed in any Semester/Year End Examination in one more than two subjects.
 - (b) Candidate for examination after that their movement is to be done, who are entitled eligible to appear in AICTE examination in accordance with the provisions of the respective Examination Ordinances.
- 22.2. In the case of foreign AICTE examination, in which there is also a private candidate shall be required to appear in the written paper and if he has passed in the main examination is granted and is permitted only if he has passed in the written paper. A candidate who has failed both in written paper and practical shall be permitted to take the parts of the written having to passed and theory paper will be taken as follow in case in two different paper.
- 22.3. Except when provided otherwise in the Ordinances, a candidate who has been declared eligible for a AICTE examination may appear in AICTE examination operation in the next examination immediately following the examination in which he was declared to be eligible and thereafter he shall be required to appear in all the papers of the next examination.
- 22.4. A candidate appearing in the AICTE Examination shall be declared to have passed the examination if he has secured the minimum pass marks in the written or theory or the case may be except when provided otherwise in the examination Ordinances. The marks obtained by the candidate in the AICTE Semester End Examination shall be subject to assessment in determining the final result obtained by the candidate in the examination.
- 22.5. If a candidate fails to pass the AICTE examination in the attempt, marks will be provided one more attempt leaves in the next AICTE Examination for that particular Candidate, in practice paper along with the regular Examination of the particular semester otherwise it is conducted by the University.
- 22.6. If such a candidate fails to pass the paper more in the second attempt leaves in the next AICTE Exam. Marks shall have to be a student of the University.

CRITERIA:

1. Council of University Examinations:

- 1.1. All University examinations shall be conducted by the Council of Examinations.
- 1.2. The syllabus of examinations shall be verified by the Council of Examinations at least 10 days prior to the first day of the commencement of the University examinations.
- 1.3. The library as well as printed examinations and dissemination these papers representing copies of students shall be approved by the Council of Examinations with the approval of the Vice-Chancellor.
- 1.4. Decisions taken by the Council of Examinations, in its functions, through its various committees for approval of questions. The Board of Management shall consult in consultation with the students. Create the Centre of Examination in accordance with the provisions of the Act and the Council of Examinations shall in consultation with its committees which have been decided to examine centre, appoint Examiners and Junior Examiners, (if any) for each examination centre and shall issue instructions for each subject.

Provided that for the purpose of approval of an Examiners Department of a centre, the minimum number of persons approving therefrom shall be at least 100:

- 1.5. The Examiners of the Examinations of each centre shall be generally responsible for the safe custody of question papers and the answer books and in case any shall occur in the University office a complete account of used question papers and answer books.
- 1.6. The Examiners shall supervise the work of scribes, marking centre and shall submit the examination sheets according to the instructions issued in this by the University.
- 1.7. The University may change the examination centre or the examination time if it deems proper without assigning any reason.
- 1.8. The University may draw issue in their approved Board of Quality standards to see that the examinations are conducted strictly in accordance with rules and provisions laid down. In the event of the Quality Inspector pointing out a breach of rules or provisions, the Vice-Chancellor may take such action as may be necessary including postponement or cancellation, wholly or in part of the examination in the centre, and if any such action is taken appeal of the action taken shall be made to the Board of Management at its next meeting.
- 1.9. Subject to the duty of the Centre representatives to attend the last session in the same period, who has failed in the term of application for approval of the examination, by way of checking the photographs given to his/her.

- 11.E The Supervisors of the Examinations shall, where it is necessary, send a confidential report to the Controller of the Examinations about the conduct of the Examinations, mentioning therein the performance of the candidates and the general behavior of the candidates. He shall send a fully report on the conduct of the examination according to all the examination situations and conduct and shall also inform the Controller of the Examinations (being held at the centre or not) or otherwise necessary, along with any other matter which he thinks fit to be brought to the notice of the University. He shall also be responsible for the maintenance and submission to the Controller of the examination, of the account of all such money received and expenditure incurred in connection with the conduct of the Examinations.
- 11.F The Glass Supervisors shall have the power to report or transmit from examination or subsequent examination cases to any of the following persons:
 - (i) That the candidate received a question or answer dissimilar to the examination rules.
 - (ii) That the candidate observed a security apparatus, article or object or irregularity or irregularities which conform with the examination rules.
 - (iii) If necessary, the Supervisors may, for private purposes. Where it is desirable to report, the Controller of the Examinations shall be advised immediately.
 - (iv) Violation observed against any provision of University Examinations shall be reported to Discipline by the Supervisors. Discipline may also be drawn from other educational institutions if so required.
 - (v) The Examinations shall make full use of the staff of the Examinations. No paper observed and no fee money will be provided to the Examinations that also had no examination.
 - (vi) Examinations decision of having the Examinations shall, however, shall be provided to be as their maximum period of 3 months.
- 11.G The The Director may cancel or postpone or all terms. If it is established that there has been leakage of question paper or any other irregularity which is an offence committed under a regulation against the University or the University of Board of Examinations.
- 11.H The Board of Management in consultation with the Academic Council may issue such general instructions for the guidance of the Examinations, Examinations, Examinations and Examinations and otherwise necessary for the proper carrying of this duty.

- 11.18. The Examiner appointed by the Controller of Examinations, out of the approval pool by using the Question paper shall use the Question paper, using the last year question paper wherever applicable, as a guide to the format of the question paper only if the pattern of the question paper is not changed by the Academic Board. The question paper shall be revised if the same is found to be weak
- 11.19. Any attempt made by or on behalf of a candidate to secure professional treatment in the medical office, the Commission, the name shall be reported to the Controller of Examinations who shall give the matter to the Vice-Chancellor for further necessary action
- 11.20. Except as otherwise decided by the Examinations Committee, the examination result or marks and the list and names list of the names created by the examinee except the individual results, shall be forwarded to Director, Department of Education 1 month from the date of declaration of the results of the examination provided that the individual names lists of students shall be forwarded 1 month after 1 month of the declaration of the examination result

- 11.15 The results of a session (including both the commercial examination and linked a commercial certificate) shall be decided by the Council of Examiners. However, after issuing of the final result, if it is shown by Council of Examiners that there has been a clerical error of award in the examination as a whole or in a particular session, it may refer the matter to the Honorary Committee, specially constituted for the purpose by the Vice-Chancellor.
- 11.16 The award list including the marks obtained by Candidates in various sessions shall be issued by the Council of Examiners, under control of the process, after the declaration of the result.

CHAPTER IV

II. CRITERIA FOR AWARING CERTIFICATES, MARKS AND DIVISIONS

- 12.1 For undergraduate students obtaining a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate in each session including 40% in semester-end examination and 40% in the student's continuous evaluation separately, shall be awarded for passing the session and meeting the required criteria. A candidate who scores less than 40% of marks in session in either of them, shall be deemed to have failed in that session.
- 12.2 A student may apply, within one month from the date of the declaration of the result, for re-checking of the examination script of a specific component in the presence of prescribed staff. Rechecking shall cover verifying whether all the questions and their parts have been duly marked against the question paper and the marking of marks. In the case of a discrepancy being found, the same shall be corrected through appropriate changes in both the original as well as marks sheet in the concerned semester-end examination.
- 12.3 For first-graduate students obtaining a minimum of 40% marks in each paper in the semester-end examination and 40% marks in each paper in the student's continuous evaluation separately shall be awarded for passing the session and meeting the required criteria. A candidate, who scores less than an aggregate of 40% of session marks in a session in either of them, shall be deemed to have failed in that session.

2.4 Further the awarded candidate will be placed in Division as follows:-

Second Division: A candidate obtaining 40% or less of the programme (WV Marks and also in the below 40% Marks shall be placed in Second Division.

Third Division: A candidate obtaining 30% or less of the programme (WV Marks and also in the below 30% Marks shall be placed in the Third Division.

First Division with Distinction: A candidate obtaining 70% or less of the programme (WV Marks in aggregate and also shall be placed in First Division with Distinction, provided the candidate scores 60% or more in the 1st attempt.

2.4.1 Duties of the Board

The Examinations Committee will be responsible for the declaration of the result. In the regard the business of the Examinations Committee will be as follows:-

To receive and give the results of the examinations conducted by the University after verifying that the results on the whole and in various subjects are in conformity with the usual standards and as presented in the Test Classes for the purpose of the same in any case where the results are doubtful.

To maintain the complete register of the passed papers and to take necessary action.

To decide cases of candidates who have not been able to sit the exam.

To receive with other papers of the awarded Council any other papers or functions as may

2.5 (i) It is hereby stated that the fees which shall apply with the Certificate of Examination in the prescribed format under whose provisions & all fees with less than of Rs. 100 as is provided by the Examinations Committee from time to time if the declaration of the results by the presentation of any answer books including all marks or results.

Provided that in case of candidates the candidate shall be allowed to have more than one paper marked.

It is also stated that no candidate shall be allowed to use any sample of questions, book, notes, material with him. He is & Project Work submitted in his 1st paper in the Examinations.

(ii) The conditions applying the evaluation of their answer scripts will have to depend the prescribed format will be decided and by the Examinations Committee from time to time.

NOTE: If any student is to be given against any Examinations, Order Supplementation or any other fee matter shall be referred to the Examinations Council with the recommendation of the Examinations Committee.

36. The off-Dialo Ware & Miscellaneous:

- 36.1. No candidate shall bring into the Examination Hall any book, paper, notes, electronic gadget or other material which may be used by him/her in connection with the Examination, nor shall he/she communicate or receive from any other candidate or give any information to the Examinations Hall.
- 36.2. No candidate shall carry or take any thing on the writing paper or Question Paper or on any other equipment, except the one or two supplied to him/her.
- 36.3. No candidate shall take or receive assistance from any other candidate or person or an Examinator to make use of any document or other source in connection with the Examination.
- 36.4. Any candidate detected cheating or making use of any document or other source in connection with an Examination shall be reported to the Controller of Examinations by the Superintendent of Examinations or through him by an Inspectors or an Officer of the University, as the case may be. The Controller of Examinations shall place the concerned matter before the Examinations Committee for consideration, which may if satisfied that the facts alleged are true and declare proceedings on the part of the candidate. Equally, the candidate may prefer the Examinations and other authorities opposing it to any University Examinations for a period not exceeding three years.
- 36.5. Any candidate detected using unfair means in an Examination shall shall be reported to the Controller of Examinations by the Superintendent of Examinations or through him by an Inspectors or by an Officer of the University, as the case may be. The Controller of Examinations shall place the concerned matter before the Examinations Committee for consideration. That may if satisfied that the facts alleged are true, and as well declare any proceedings. Equally, the candidate may prefer the Examinations and other authorities opposing it to any University Examinations for a period not exceeding three years.
- 36.6. Any candidate bringing any book, paper, notes or other material to the Examinations Hall shall be reported to the Examinations Committee for consideration by the Controller of Examinations, as reported by the Superintendent of Examinations or through him by an Inspectors or by an Officer of the University, as the case may be, and the Examinations Committee may, if satisfied that the facts alleged are true, and that the candidate has not made sufficient effort, Equally, the candidate may prefer the Examinations
- 36.7. Any candidate, who is the subject of the Superintendent of Examinations to give, of any communication to the Examinations Hall, other than the communication within the meaning of the off-Dialo Sub-Para 1, 3, 5, 4, 7 and 8 of this Statute, may be reported by the Superintendent of Examinations to the Page and shall be reported to the Examinations Committee by the Controller of Examinations. The said Committee may, if satisfied that the facts alleged are true, Equally, the candidate may prefer the Examinations for that year.

- 19.11. In case a person who is not a candidate withdraws, it shall be his duty as Examinator, on behalf of a board that withdraws, to call for documents in support of his application, to keep them at his disposal and with the permission of the board, his conditions and arrangements shall govern and such possible conditions shall be taken as noted:
- (a) The candidate withdraws who did not give the Examinator (exam/official) full or allowed leave governing any course of studies in their agreement at any Examination of the University in issue.
 - (b) In case the person who has implemented the candidate withdraws, is a student of the University, he/she shall be advised from making any Examination of the University in issue.
 - (c) If the person who has implemented the candidate withdraws, is not a student of the University, he/she may be invited over to the Office for appropriate action.
- 19.12. In case a candidate is agreeing to the Examinator for improvement of Division Percentage of Marks and is found to be using unfair means, the result of his/her Examination in the Faculty or school he/she has already appeared, shall also be cancelled, in addition to the course that might be taken against him/her for using unfair means, which may apply for improvement of his/her Division Percentage of Marks.
- 19.17. Any punishment imposed on the using suspect shall be following the recommendations of the relevant government body.
- 19.18. The Organization of an examination centre shall also extend against an examinee who is found using or attempting to use unfair means in the examination hall or within the premises of the examination centre during the year of examination, in the following manner:
- (a) The examinee shall be called upon to surrender all the examination materials found in his or her possession including the answer book and a memorandum shall be prepared with due evidence.
 - (b) The names of the examinee and the invigilator shall be recorded.
 - (c) The examinee shall be issued a fresh answer book marked 'Duplicate Copy' (after Mark) in average case or within the prevailing time provided for the examination.
 - (d) All the materials so collected and the entire evidence along with a report of the examinee and the answer book(s) reported shall be forwarded to the Department by name in a separate confidential sealed envelope paper marked 'Confidential' along with the identification of the Examinations.
 - (e) The material so collected from the examinee together with both the answer book(s), viz. the answer book collected which carry unfair means and the other suspect

100) The cases of the use of advertisements in the examination is reported by the Commissioner that they will be report of the Executive shall be provided by the Examination Committee. The committee shall after examining the cases, decide the action to be taken in such case and report to the Board of Management through appropriate authority.

101) A candidate found sitting during the examination hour shall be removed to the centre. If the candidate continues to do so in spite of the warning by the invigilator, the centre book of such candidate shall be withdrawn and a second centre book shall be applied. Only the second centre book shall be use for candidate. The Board shall be reported and copy to the Committee of the Examination. If the candidate is reported to be absent again or absent long shall be given and the committee may be reported to the Department from this particular page.

102) If a candidate is found guilty of using or attempting to use or having used unfair means or an examination card or copying from other books or notes or from the answer of other other candidate or helping or receiving help from any other candidate or helping with him in the examination hall without consent with the examination or in any other manner whatsoever, the Examination Committee or the Committee appointed for the purpose by the Examination Committee may cancel his examination and also declare him from appearing in any of the examinations of the University for two years or more years according to the nature of the offence.

103) The Examination Committee may cancel the examination of a candidate and/or declare him from appearing in any examination of the university for one or more years, if it is deemed advisable that the candidate has in any manner guilty of misconduct in connection with his examination and/or committed to or be allowed for copying of university records including the answer book made about rules change agreement and his life.

104) The Examination Committee may cancel the examination of a candidate and/or declare him from appearing in any exam of the university for one or more years, if it is deemed advisable that the candidate has committed misconduct in the examination by misrepresenting the facts or by attempting to bring unfairness to examine.

105) All the records of Examination and results will be stored by the University in a systematic grid of three years from the date of declaration of results of the concerned examination.

III. Institute's Governance Committee

It is the duty of the Institute's Governance Committee—composed of faculty from the Institute's various schools—to advise the members of the Institute's governing governing body of questions regarding the Institute's governance and to provide recommendations of the Board of the Faculty. The members of the Institute's Governance Committee shall be appointed by the Institute's Governing Committee as recommended by the Vice-Chancellor. The Vice-Chancellor shall report appropriate matters to the members of the Institute's Governance Committee, including the evaluation of faculty of the Institute's Governance Committee.

CHAPTER 7

III. Appointment of Examiners

3.1 The office of the Chancellor of Examinations shall prepare the exam syllabus for candidates who are admitted to the program of studies for appointment as students. The list shall be in two parts: the first part containing the names of persons residing in Canada or the University Department and LaSalle or in the institution identified as persons of the University and the second part containing names of persons who are the members of the University qualified for appointment as students.

3.2 The list shall contain as far as possible information relating to the persons included therein in the following particulars:

- (i) The academic qualifications and standing regarding a Candidate's and previous studies
- (ii) The field of specialization
- (iii) The name of the institutions of the University and place to which they have been sent as students in the past

3.3 The list as prepared shall be made available to the Examinations Committee as recommended under Section 14 of the First Schedule.

3.4 The office of the Chancellor of Examinations shall also give the Examinations Committee the appropriate number of candidates approved to appear in each examination session and the list of names of each person. The Examinations Committee shall be advised of the names of candidates included.

3.5 The examination committee shall, in the light of the provisions of the following paragraphs, recommend:

- (i) A panel of three names for the appointment of the paper writers of each module paper
- (ii) A list of names of persons for appointment as co-examiners where necessary, in order of the faculty to be appointed

- (d) A list of names of persons for appointment as justices or judges of the Four-Year Commission. The names included in the list shall be sufficient for the conduct of judicial. The Four-Year Commission is effective 2015.
- (e) The Four-Year Commission shall appoint judges, as justices, judges of the Four-Year Commission, from among persons recommended by the nominating commission. It may, however, appoint a justice, chief justice, if not included in the list of names recommended by the nominating commission. If he is selected from the group of justice judges, the minimum qualifications and the appointment will not be subject to the provisions of the following paragraph.
- (f) The qualifications of the judge or justice and the Commission shall be as follows:

14.1 Co-Examiner

The qualifications shall be the same as for the paper – subject but the minimum teaching/ professional experience required may be less by one year than that prescribed in the case of the Paper-writer.

Provided that in case of degree examination where sufficient number of qualified candidates in a subject with the alternate qualifications is not available, teacher in An University College, Department and Institutes of the University with at least three years teaching experience in the degree – first – year level in the subject shall be eligible by agreement in Consultation.

- 14.2 (i) In case of practical and Two – Year examinations at the Two – Semester level, external examiner shall be a person, not below the rank of an Assistant.
- (ii) In case of practical and Two – Year examinations at the first degree level, the external examiner shall be a member of the subject with not less than three years experience of teaching the subject in the degree and / or post graduate level.
- (iii) The internal examiner in case of practical examinations both at the degree and the post-graduate level shall be appointed from amongst the teachers of the Institute, whose regular conditions are to be considered in the matter in the consideration of the Head of the Institute.
- (iv) The internal examiner in the post – graduate level in case of Practical / Two-Year examinations shall not exclusively be a teacher of the University Department / College.
- (v) Except in the faculties of Medicine, Dentistry, Engineering Technology and Education, all external examiner in case of practical examinations at the first-degree level shall as far as possible be appointed from amongst the teachers of the institutions in service of the University.
- (vi) Definitely 1/2 of whole paper shall be the post-graduate and first degree examination in any subject in external.
- (vii) What is the subject, First-Year examination is applied to paper-work shall be the Head Institute. Assessment other than the paper shall be the Directorate.
- (viii) All Co-examiners shall be named, provided that if sufficient number of qualified teacher in a subject is not available by agreement in Consultation, external Co-examiner may be appointed.

21. The appointment as Examiners and De-Examiners for students in the University Department and College and center of the University shall normally be consistent on the basis of having subject qualifications of other candidates for such appointments.
 22. Ordinarily no less than Examiners shall be appointed for every subject. They shall normally belong to different centers.
 23. Ordinarily wherever that two papers are shall be appointed from across the entire Department or Institute/Centre in the same subject group, not necessarily.
 24. The use of an External Examiners shall be appointed as an external Examiners in the examination.
 25. The use shall normally be given more than one external practical examination days provided that in case of cases where the total number of candidates appearing in years (I, and II) is in the range 1000 or less than 100, one external examiner may be appointed for all the three examinations.
 26. In case of more practical examinations are external examiners shall not normally examine more than 100 candidates.
 27. In case of written examinations an examiner shall not normally examine more than 100 scripts and a De-examiner shall be appointed if the number of candidates appearing in the paper is more than 100.
 28. When recommending stated his responsibility to ensure that English is not the sole medium of examination, the Examiners - Committee shall ensure that the candidate recommended can evaluate the performance in English.
 29. The provisions of this paragraph (2) above shall not apply in case of Examination in the Institute of Engineering, Technology, Education, Medical, Dentistry, Pharmacy, Nursing etc.
 30. Examiners shall be appointed for the examination of duration of one year only but they shall be eligible for re-appointment.
 31. Any person who has acted as an Examiners (paper setter) in examination or external, Trial/Type examination for three consecutive years shall normally not be eligible for re-appointment until a period of one year elapses here on the year in which he has acted as an Examiners and the year in which he is re-appointed.
- Provided that such a gap will not be necessary in case of external examination if the number of available eligible candidates in the subject concerned is less than the number of internal candidates required.
- Provided also that on the recommendation of the Examiners Committee a specialist or subject may be appointed for two years provided the expiry of the three-year period without a gap.
32. An examiner may be de-authorized any time even before the expiry of the three-year period if on the opinion of the Examiners Committee, his work is found to be unsatisfactory.

21. An examinee's work shall be deemed to be unsatisfactory if:
 - (a) Questions of such nature are found in his work as to require re-reading and answers which appear irrelevant;
 - (b) He fails to heed by the Examination Committee to have copied the work without good reason;
 - (c) There have arisen queries from the Chief Examiner, or
 - (d) in the opinion of the Examinations Committee, there are reasonable grounds to believe it is necessary to enquire into the candidate's reliability or honesty in these examinations;
 - (e) It does not contain complete answers for the paper (e.g. does the paper say "make three" or "write the standard or balanced equations" include the prescribed number of the formulae or such conditions prescribed by the Examinations Committee).
 22. The paper-setter shall lay down a memorandum of instructions for the guidance of the examinees as to the best way to communicate with regard to the form & the contents of the answers to be written.
 23. If the any marks assessment is made to reduce the zero-marks or to punish the failure of the Chief Examiner after using the greater paper, he shall be entitled to receive only one-half of the amount of fee for paper setting and the balance shall be payable to the examinee who provides the marks of the Chief Examiner (excepted).
- Should the 1/2th paper-setter fee be less than 1/2th, or the paper-setter fee is less than the value of the zero-marks, full fee provided for paper setting shall be paid to the train.
24. In any subject, if a Three-Year Examination is prescribed, a limit of two questions of what one shall be as normal examination and the other the beyond numbers shall remain for later.
 25. In the case of Examinations like M.Phil., M.Litt., M. Phil. etc. when there is possibility to fix up a paper or a project, there shall be a limit of two questions for evaluating the thesis. The maximum number of marks for the thesis shall be equally divided between the two questions each of which shall mark the thesis independently. If the evaluation of these two questions differ by 20% or more shall be referred to the third examiner (other than a teacher of the University) who shall award marks not at all of the maximum marks for the thesis. The aggregate of two (of the three) marks scores in each other and in the last amongst of the candidates shall be taken as the correct evaluation.
 26. In case of an examination for a research degree, the Examinations Committee shall recommend the such thesis to be awarded by a panel of at least six persons, one of which a non-our persons shall belong to an outside University, whether in India or abroad.
27. The practice
 - (a) Shall possess a Doctoral degree in the subject and have at least two year teaching experience at the post graduate level or research experience.
 - (b) An admission of degree in the subject.

- 2) The person shall act as a juror in no manner other than being summoned or produced in person, if any, or be released a ruling by the commission provided that the person shall not file from being so summoned for judicial or a court order that in which the release is required.
- 4) The person shall not be released or relieved for any commission if any of the release is required or he appeared in the commission.
4. Notwithstanding the provisions contained in these subsections the Vice-Chancellor in consultation with the Academic Council and the Executive Committee may in so far as the particular commission is concerned hereby, all or some of the above-mentioned provisions.

ORDINANCE III

Examination fees to be charged for various courses of the University

- a) The Council of Examinations / Examiners of the University shall notify the fees payable by the student for various courses of examination, after the same is approved by the Vice-Chancellor. A candidate who has not paid the prescribed fees before the start of examination, shall not be admitted to sit for or appear in the examination. The Chancellor may in his discretion allow, in certain cases of genuine hardship, an extension of the last date of payment of fees. The result of such extension shall, however, be voided till all the dues are cleared.
- b) The Examination fees shall be decided by the Academic Council and approved by the Board of Management from time to time.
- c) The Candidate who fails to present himself/herself for Examination, shall not be entitled to any refund of fees or to have a step in respect for a subsequent Examination. However, if a student candidate is unable to appear in the Examination for reasons beyond his/her control, he/she may file a request for the next Examination provided that the application for waiving the fees for the next Examination must be made to the Council of Examinations / Examiners of the University, by the Examinative within three months of the completion of the Examination concerned and shall be approved by a Waiver Certificate.
- d) Provided, however, that a candidate shall not be entitled to the adjustment of examination fees if he/she changes the faculty to be selected in case of post-graduate examination.
- e) The fees paid by a candidate/candidate who is allowed their appearing in an examination for the first time in a session at a university/university, will not be refunded under any circumstances.
- f) There shall be no refund of examination fees, irrespective of charge in the mode of a candidate.
- g) A candidate who was to sit for an exam or other exam or unable to present himself/herself at an examination shall not receive a refund of fees provided that the Vice-Chancellor or the representatives of the Council of Examinations / Examiners of the University, make the ruling notified by waiving the fees and making request to request through

document submitted to him, about the agreement or non of it, under the seal of his office in agreement of the Secretary, under the seal of the Secretary, see Attachment

- (iii) The document free of a candidate who does not appear in the document may be returned to him or her for further or revision.
- (iv) The name first put by a candidate whose application for appearing in an examination is cancelled on account of producing fraudulent documents or giving false particulars shall not be valid.

ORDINANCE II

Conditions of Residency of the Students of the University

- 1. The Board constituted by the University / College / Department shall provide the rules concerning and fulfill the requirements the conditions regarding the academic standards, performance. It shall implement the instruction received at all levels.
- 2. Every student at all levels shall maintain a high standard of discipline and conduct, general conduct, after entry of a student.
- 3. Each student desiring of taking admission to the board shall submit his application on the prescribed form to the Chief Teacher after admission in the university / college along with proof of admission. He shall appear before board examination or general class test for persons / local candidates and the original document.
- 4. The admission to the board shall be passed at the discretion of the Teacher in consultation with the Chief / Teacher. Special case will have to be taken in accordance with the following conditions:
 - (a) On admission to the Board, the parents shall fill up the requisite forms, documents, fee, local papers, and money advanced to the board.
 - (b) The student shall undergo the exam offered to him / her. He / she shall not change the course and the Applicant in case of the / her name without the express permission of the board Teacher.
 - (c) The candidate shall be responsible for the loss and maintenance of the furniture, furnishing, books, etc. Any damage to board property shall be made good by the candidate.
 - (d) The candidate are admitted from every city / district / application other than provided is specifically permitted by the Teacher or ruling.

8. The students are prohibited to possess firearms, weapons or potentially dangerous instruments. Detention will be made with necessary including regulations.
9. Consumption of drugs / alcohol / substances / smoking are strictly prohibited in the hostel premises. Detention will be strictly dealt with including regulations.
10. The students belonging to residential / colonies within the hostel premises will be strictly dealt with including regulations.
11. The students residing in the University Guest shall pay such fees as may be prescribed by the Management Committee to them.
12. Each Hostel shall have University, who shall be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor on the recommendation of the Governing body for a period of three years, or such term and conditions as may be prescribed by the Board of Management Committee to them.

ORDINANCE II

Provision Regarding Disciplinary Action against the Student

1. Every student in the University shall at all times be of good behavior, show allegiance to nation, respect persons and things, take proper interest in co-curricular activities, shall observe a code of conduct, shall attend and submit the register in a timely manner to the student of co-curricular activities and observe all rules of discipline of the University of which he/she is a student and of the University.
2. Each student shall show due respect and courtesy to the teachers, administrative and other employees and all staff of the institution and good neighbors, behave in a socially better manner.
3. Any violation of the code of conduct or breach of any rule or regulation of the University by the student shall constitute an act of misconduct and shall make him / her liable for disciplinary action.
4. The following acts shall constitute acts of gross misconduct and students engaging in any of them shall be liable a disciplinary action against them:
 - (a) Smoking the articles and displaying indecent pictures and symbols in the University premises.
 - (b) Indulging in Unethical / Unlawful and damaging University and / or Public property or property of a fellow student.
 - (c) Quarrelling, fighting and causing disruptive elements in the University premises against its teachers / employees / support staff and other workers.
 - (d) Possession and use of firearms, weapons and potentially dangerous instruments, etc.
 - (e) Consumption and use of drugs / alcohol / substances / tobacco etc.

- (d) Including or copying, what is strictly prohibited in the University's exam policy.
 - (e) Any other act which the Examinatory Committee may determine to be undesirable.
2. That a student has been found guilty of breach of discipline within or outside the premises of the University or an institution, or previous offences in his/her past, of misconduct, the Dean of the concerned department / institution or other such person as may be notified upon to the Examinatory Committee and Vice-Chancellor along with the Registrar. The Examinatory Committee with the approval from the Vice-Chancellor may, according to the nature and gravity of the offence:
 - i. Suspend such student from attending the classes for one month for three months.
 - ii. Suspend such student from the institution.
 - iii. Expel such a student from appearing in the concerned examination.
 - iv. Institute such student.
 3. Before instituting such punishment as mentioned in clause of the concerned department / institution, shall give the student concerned an opportunity of personal hearing and record the interests of instituting the punishment or penalty.
 4. The Dean of the institution concerned shall have the power to temporarily suspend the student from the institution for such a time as may be necessary or suitable or supply him/her with suitable or reasonable work to be done within the stipulated period.
 5. The person having written a student's name regarding the completion of an assignment shall be retained in the circulation of his/her assignment for appearing in an Examination provided he/she is found correct.
 6. The suspension of a student from an institution shall entail the removal of his/her name from the register of the institution.
 7. The list of the student returned from the University will be maintained.
 8. A student who returned will not be readmitted to the University before the completion of a period of three years or equivalent duration (whichever is higher) from the date of his/her suspension. A student who is readmitted to the University after the prescribed duration from the date of his/her suspension will adhere to all the rules of University and follow the same as if he/she was in the university as a student.
 9. The Director, Care of Students' welfare (DCS) shall be appointed from amongst the teaching staff of the University, Department and Institution by the Vice-Chancellor for a period of one year to maintain the discipline. In case of emergency, the student concern may continue with the approval of the Vice-Chancellor.
 10. The process and form of the Director 'Care of Students' welfare (DCS) shall be determined by the Vice-Chancellor from time to time.

- (d) Dean, Academic Affairs
- (e) Dean, Student Management
- (f) Chairpersons & Audit Officer, Finance & Operations
- (g) Rectors of the University

11.2 The functions of the Board of Quality Management shall be as follows:

To monitor, evaluate and report to the Executive Management Board, including to the following organs of University Management:

- (a) The Board of the University, particularly, with respect to
- (b) Facilities for management and maintenance
- (c) Strategy of the University, with respect to human resources management issues
- (d) The overall functioning of the IT and website
- (e) Management of IT systems
- (f) Academic and graduate management or the ISO and EQUIS guidelines and/or the guidelines of other external regulatory bodies.

4. **Executive Degree Award Committee**

The committee of the committee shall be as under:

- (a) The Director, Director-Chairman
- (b) The Vice-Chancellor
- (c) Dean, Academic Affairs
- (d) The Registrar

- 41. The committee shall consider cases of those distinguished persons who have made significant contributions to the work of the people's country in view of their role in the fields of the sciences or who have acquired various awards of distinction or who have made significant community contributions in their field.
- 42. The committee shall forward the names so considered to the Governing Body for final decision.

ANNEXURE 3A

MoU of Cooperation and Collaboration with other Universities and Institutions of Higher Education

- 6. The University shall seek cooperation and collaboration with the existing Universities and Institutes of Higher Education in India and abroad and conduct a Visitation of Universities (VU) involving the concerned areas of cooperation and collaboration mutually agreed upon.

2. The University shall open its own distance education Study Centre, Distance Education Regional Learning Centre, in the area of Chittagong to promote Digital Education in emerging and ruralised areas of justice.
3. The University may collaborate with Universities and Institutes of Fisheries engaged in Higher Education in the country and abroad for the Research and consultancy work that may be done.
4. The University may collaborate with the Government Organisations including for providing advisory, coding and guidance in the matters of, especially, water resources of the country and in the creation of research and collaborative centres.
