Extensive discussions take place at the Board of Studies meeting and, if necessary, revise the syllabus, and send it to the Academic Council for final

approval. Once approved in the Academic Council, University syllabus is considered final for the academic session until further changes. University has a strong desire to serve the society by developing human and professional qualities in the students.

MATS University practices various student centric programs for their experimental learning, participative learning and problemsolving methodologies for enriching learning experiences. All programmes of university are integrated practical courses with adequate experiential practice for the students. We also provide platform for participative learning to the students. Moreover, projects, field-works, seminars, excursions, NSS, NCC etc.

Experiential learning: Students are allowed to conduct experiments

independently in practical classes. Mini projects, major projects and internships in industries & industrial visits as a part of industry institute interaction.

Participative learning: Students are motivated to participate in Quiz Competitions, Paper Presentation, Technical Seminars and Online Certification Courses to get the participative learning environment. Student development programs and workshops are conducted to enhance the learning capabilities of the students. Every classroom is provided with projector and internet facilities (Videos, NPTEL) to enhance their knowledge. Problem solving: Encouragement is given to take part actively in AICTE/UGC/ sponsored programs. Students are motivated to take part in Training and Placement, Entrepreneurship Development and Incubation Centre (EDIC) and assisting in consultancy activities. Students are involved in assisting research work with Quality Assurance, Research, Innovation, Incubation, Industry Interaction, Development, Entrepreneurship, Education and Social Responsibility.

Moreover, University provided refresher courses and faculty Development Programmes for the teachers. Facilitated by these programmes, the teachers are effectively using ICT enabled tools like laptops, headphones, writing pads, internet, video-lectures, audio-lectures, PPT presentations, virtual labs, YouTube links, e-contents etc.

It helps in conducting departmental Seminars and community outreach programs as well. MATS University encourages staff and students to travel to national and international conferences to present their research work. MATS University provides

3.3 - Innovation Ecosystem

3.3.1 - Institution has created an eco-system for innovations including Incubation centre and other initiatives for creation and transfer of knowledge

Awareness meets, workshops, seminars and guest lectures on Entrepreneurship are organized. Students are provided opportunities to directly interact with outstanding entrepreneurs excelling in their field. The sole objective of the Incubation Center is to facilitate students to convert their Ideas into Technological Innovations.

The incubation services is provided by MATS University to those Entrepreneurs submitting their ideas, for being a probable self-sustaining business enterprise in manufacturing or service sector. The services is provided through established incubators being setup by the department in due course of time under Startup Chhattisgarh initiative of the state government.
